Theme of the Conference

The origine people of India are in trouble due to the recent eviction verdict of the supreme court of India (2019). The people called Tribes are need to vacate the forest, is because, the forest dwellers are “Exploiting” the forest resources which leads to distruction of forest for future generation as well as destroying the living organism and vegetation, is one among the reasons for the said verdict.

Where as the constitution of India in its directive principle of state policies and even article 32-56 clearly says that it is the primary responsibility of the state to undertake and to initiate socio economic development programmes for the well being of its citizen. Though, many planned efforts have been initiated after independence under various plannes and programmes. Yet the living status of the tribble people are not upto the expected level.

The niti ayoga (which is recently established in place of planning commission) also suggested for implementation of suitable development programmes for tribals uplifments is accured. Through, for the past 5 years of

invitation of niti ayoga no visible change, in the life of forest dwellers. Then who is the responsible for such status of living conditions? Whether the governments, NGOs; civil society organisations, high courts, supreme court, elite groups, the people representative? CBO's or at last the people representatives?

These issues need to be caused at the gross root level as well as at the level of intellectuals; i.e. universities and research institutions, as a matter of the fact that the supreme court of india in its recent judgement stated that the forest dwellers are to vacate their habitations, within a stipulated time period. Therefore the forest dweller's have become panic about their future, and there is no remedies from the governments so, it is the greater conflict between the constitutional concept of welfare state and supreme court in democratic india.

Even after laps of seven decades of democracy in India; the plight of the tribals remain blank. Hence, the proposed conference is organised with the following objectives.
