



NAHRA Judges Clinic Presenter Selection Criteria

Effective October 1, 2018

- Must be a current judge in good standing with NAHRA.
- Must have actively run a dog in the NAHRA field test program within the last three years.
- Must have at least ten (10) senior judging points and a total of twenty-five (25) or more overall judging points.
- Must be articulate, be comfortable with PowerPoint, leading discussions in a group setting and be able to keep a group on track.
- The Regional Director should attempt to maintain an adequate number of presenters to support clinics in their region.
- Names will be submitted by the Regional Director, and approved by the NAHRA EBOD.
- It is suggested to limit the number of presenters to maintain consistency in the presentations.
- Suggestions for picking presenters –
 - The presenters must agree to follow the general format of the NAHRA Judging Clinic handouts and PowerPoint presentation. The presenter may modify and enhance the information as long as the basic material is not sacrificed.
 - Recognized by peers as a competent and knowledgeable judge who communicates effectively with handlers.
 - Is an avid supporter of the NAHRA program
 - The presenters should be
 - Enthusiastic
 - Assertive and confident
 - Monitor and adjust to situations as they arise to stay focused
 - Communicate in a clear, logical and understandable way
 - Demonstrates organization during the presentation
 - Able to lead an interactive session to include the participants throughout the clinic.
 - Willing to answer follow up questions after the clinic.
- The Regional Director will apply for and schedule each Judge's Clinic for EBOD approved at a minimum of 30 days prior to clinic date. Additionally list the date, location, host and approved Presenters. The EBOD also determined that each clinic should utilize two presenters.
