

Informed Consent Re New Hampshire Training

As part of today's training, we will conduct research by asking you questions about your experiences, practices, and beliefs about mediation. This will be done as part of the New Hampshire Mediation Training Study.

A notetaker will record some of the answers without including anyone's name or other identifying information. This will continue until the training program ends today.

We will summarize some of the questions and answers, including some answers (without identification of the speaker) and, after the training, the summary will be emailed to everyone in this training. This summary also will be included in research publications and presentations.

Your participation is voluntary. If you do not want your statements to be included in this summary, you don't have to answer any questions or you can ask the notetaker not to include your statements in the notes and there will be no penalty or loss of benefits for doing so. [Identify notetaker.]

You generally will not be asked to discuss specific cases. If you want to mention a case to illustrate your point, do not provide anyone's name or identifying information.

There will be no risk to you for participating in this research. You would get the benefit of learning about the experience and views of other New Hampshire practitioners.
