Mission Statement

We are an inclusive, forward-looking Episcopal Church that seeks to grow in Christ through worship, education, and fellowship, serves Christ by ministering to local and global communities and shares Christ in following His command to “Love one another as I have loved you.”

Vision Statement

Our Vision at St. Peter’s is to be an inclusive, vibrant Christian Community honoring our Episcopal heritage by achieving excellence in worship, mission, education and fellowship.

The Project

This Campaign seeks to raise a minimum of \$500,000 to continue the process of making our building more accessible, accommodating, and welcoming to all. Through the Capital Campaign, we plan to:

- Add an electric lift, air conditioning and a bathroom, as well as make other improvements to the Smith Fellowship Hall (\$200,000 - \$250,000);
- Add an access ramp between the church parking lot and the office area (\$30,000 - \$40,000);
- Revitalize the Prospect Street entrance (including repair to the Cloister windows) (\$80,000 - \$120,000);
- Make other much needed repairs and improvements to our church building (e.g., boiler repairs, electrical/lighting upgrades, repairs to St. Margaret’s Hall, and grading work for our proposed Columbarium) (\$70,000 - \$90,000).

Giving Opportunities

\$500,000 Goal

3-5-year pledge (at donor’s option)

Donor Levels

Major: \$20,000 - \$100,000

Leadership: \$3,000 - \$19,999

St. Peter’s Friend: \$1,000 - \$2,999

The Many Ways of Giving

Pledges – Gifts may be pledged over a multi-year period (3-5 years). Payments are at the donor’s request—monthly, quarterly, yearly, etc. Pledges are a statement of intent OVER and above your current generosity to St. Peter’s Stewardship.

Other options: Appreciated Assets, Deferred Giving, Memorial Gifts, Matching Gifts, IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (RMD’s for those 70 ½ years and older).

Donors are a vital force in making this project a success. St. Peter’s will honor those participating in each level on a plaque installed in Smith Fellowship Hall.

This will provide our parish with a prudent, sound financial foundation. Our true foundation is always Jesus Christ, Our Lord. Because of Him, St. Peter’s Episcopal Church moves boldly and confidently into our future.
