- We're expecting the Trump Administration to release proposed changes to <u>Section</u> <u>1557</u> that would negatively impact trans health.
- Join us at the Department of <u>Education on May 8</u> to speak up for LGBTQ-affirming health education framework.
- Join us in advocating for the #Out4MentalHealth sponsored bill, <u>AB 512</u>, during LGBTQ Advocacy Day on May 14.
- Governor Newsom's revised budget will be released this month by May 14 and we'll be keeping an eye on how those investments will impact LGBTQ health and wellness.
- Bills that made it through their policy committee must pass out fiscal committee and their house of origin by the end of this month.
