Program Description:

The CNA/GNA program combines multiple health concentrations using a “build-up” model with an option of students earning stackable credentials. In this CNA/GNA program, training will include:

- Measuring and recording blood pressure
- Counting and recording respirations (breathing rates)
- Helping patients with limited mobility who cannot move much on their own
- Providing hygienic (cleaning and bathing) care for patients
- Demonstrating hand hygiene
- The transfer and transport of patients

Average starting wage:
\$11 - \$15 per hour

The program will also teach you about health care workplace skills, including:

- Customer service
- Working well with others
- Handling conflict
- Job hunting (creating resumés, writing cover letters, and participating in interviews)
- Managing your money

Credential or Certification Earned:

By completing this program, you will earn a CCBC Continuing Education Workforce Training Certificate. Additionally, students who successfully complete the instruction and clinical portions of this class will be able to apply to the Maryland Board of Nursing and test for the Certified Nursing Assistant certification. Student are also eligible to test for the state Geriatric Nursing Assistant certification given by the National Nurse Aide Assessment Program.

What do CNA/GNAs do?

CNA/GNAs work with residents in long-term care homes, assisted living facilities, or private organization that provide in-home care. The CNA’s or GNA’s primary duties are assisting with activities of daily living, which may include: helping patients/clients with meals, personal grooming, and toileting. Additional responsibilities include: obtaining and monitoring patient vital signs (i.e. pulse rate or blood pressure).

- Enjoy working with people, especially older adults, people who cannot move much by themselves, people who have trouble with speaking, or people with dementia
- Are comfortable giving hands-on care, such as taking blood pressure, checking respiration, bathing, feeding, and helping a patient get from a bed to a chair or wheelchair with a transfer belt device
- Want work with a consistent schedule: typical CNA/GNA shifts are 7am-3pm, 3pm-11pm, or 11pm-7am
- Are positive, mature, hard-working, and dependable

This program and career might be a POOR fit for you if you...

- Prefer to work alone
- Are uncomfortable assisting older adults or people with mental and/or physical limitations
- Are not comfortable giving hands-on care
- Cannot work on your feet a lot
- Cannot physically assist other individuals with moving and bathing
- Cannot work the typical CNA/GNA shifts

To be admitted to this program, you must:

- Pass a math and reading test
- Complete a career assessment
- Pass a criminal record background check
- Pass a drug test
- Complete an in-person interview
