- o FY19 Budget BAWIB Ms. Michele Ahern
 - We have closed out FY18.
 - ➤ The carry in for WIOA grants was Adult 12%, DW 18% and Youth 20%.
 - \triangleright WIOA Youth is at \$77,752 which is 12% expended at 8/31/2018.
 - Allocations received for WIOA: Adult was up 5.3%, DW down 8.5% and Youth up 3.7%
 - Other Non-WIOA Grants -
 - Connecting Activities up 78% over last year due to receiving three (3) pockets of money base allocation, extended services, and special planning project.

 - o 2018 Summer Job Program
 - > Enrolled and received employments.
 - 29 (final number) employers participated in the program.
 - **Banking & Finance Training Program**
 - This is a state-awarded program; 2 years for a Year-Round program.
 - The goal is to enroll 20 out-of-school youth (OSY); 17-21-year-old; the youth must be a Brockton resident.
 - > The Banking & Finance Training program is designed to provide an introduction and overview of the financial/banking services industry.
 - Six (6) local regional banks will be advising for this program.

 - Youth enrollment goal for FY19 is 12.
 - Case management services provided to 5 youth currently enrolled in the program.
 - The YouthWorks staff is working steady and diligently.

 - 6 youth are currently enrolled.
 - Youth enrollment goal for FY19 is 10.
 - Casement management services provided to 5 youth currently enrolled in the program.
