CRITERIA

- Applicants must be completing or have completed high school successfully with a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Applicants must be accepted as a full-time student at an HBCU for the upcoming academic semester. If scholarship money is awarded, this is the only program that will receive the funds on behalf of the applicant.
- Applicants must plan to pursue studies at a historically black college or university (HBCU).
- Applicants must plan to pursue studies in a field associated with STEM, MIQA, technical or operation manufacturing.
- Applicants must be a citizen or legal permanent resident of the United States.
- Applicants must complete and submit a scholarship application by February 15, 2021.

AWARD

If selected as a recipient, the student will receive a \$10,000 scholarship annually, \$40,000 total over a four-year period, if eligible. The HBCU Week Foundation will form a committee and award the scholarship based on a comprehensive evaluation process.

Areas reviewed by the committee include but are not limited to the following:

- Academic accomplishments
- Reference letters
- Financial Need
- STEM and future career aspirations
- Community involvement

The HBCU Week Foundation will pay the scholarship directly to the educational institution.

Scholarships are awarded annually.

SCHOLARSHIP ADMINISTRATION

The HBCU Week Foundation committee will lead the process for receiving and reviewing applications, selecting recipients, and making scholarship awards. The committee working together will read applications, determine the best candidates(s), and then vote for approval. We will then notify the recipients and award the scholarship funds via phone call, email, and official letter.
