Dayna Luka, DHS:

- Safe sleep administration amended rules requirements for Registered child care homes and lic child care centers adopted to begin on 2/24/17:
 - Written policies: include equipment, training, sleeping positions policy
 - Training for all employees and directors
 - Making clear on safe sleep
 - Working on implementation of rules/announcements
 - Training will need to provide certificate: PATCH, AAP webinar, BetterKidCare webinar
 - Working with Safe Sleep for recommendations for training opportunities
 - Looking at training DHS license child care workers to visit facilities for compliance; possibly looking at bringing in David to look at cribs/play-yard; workers do 2-visits, 1-unannounced
- David Cheng from CPSC, jurisdiction over standards, revised crib standards recently, more safer/stringent; platforms were falling, instructions were not clear, worked on

Ralph Goto: learn to swim program

- 30 yrs ago learn to swim program in public schools, all 4th graders in 80's
- Revitalizing Learn to Swim group: will work on obtaining DOE support
- Statistical: drownings are low but still exists (pools, bathtubs)
- National effort, as well as international (South East Asia)
- Need to look at rescues and prevention numbers
- WHO: Drowning event: individual is submerged, classified as fatal and non-fatal, no longer have near drowning
- Working on starting program, possibly Kailua complex using district park; need to figure out transportation to pool first; involving Dr. John Prince for curriculum
- Data need to look at "e-codes"
- Kids underserved areas or don't go to classes/ Y
- CDR: Dr. I, hotel pools / private pools are at risk
- Bridgette Velasco (DOH): 10 fold non-fatal taken to ER, 10-13 folds non-fatal?
- Requesting KIPC support on letterhead
- Biggest challenge will be financial support (trans, insurance, instructors...)
- KIPC= board in full support on letterhead per LD
- Doing survey on Learn to Swim (do they have a program, and if they don't why) with every Elementary school

Chief Kory Chock: EMS

- Pulse Point, free app on every device; alerts you if CPR needed within 1 mile, tell you where AED located
- 800 Cardiac Arrests in Hawaii, survival rate 9%
- Next week press release next week 11:00 from EMS @ YMCA Castle room (Senator Hirono), 2/22
 - Download app
 - Within .25 mi location of cardiac arrest
 - Dispatcher will notify you if you are w/in .25 mi
 - When you receive notification, gives you address of location
 - Continues GPS monitoring for program
 - Take a picture of AED if not on app, will send to EMS to confirm
 - Notifications only for public locations (Malls, stores), not private residence
 - AED institutes assisting with AED locations
 - Collaboration with CTR (?) wireless location
 - Will provide instruction on giving CPR

 - TV & furniture tip-overs: 1 death every 3 weeks (nationally)
 - Child proofing

4 bills safe sleep related: moving to next committee

Smoking related, e-cigarette, smoking w/kids in the car

Traffic safety: HB491 incorporating additional funds for crosswalk/sidewalk

Nat'l safety board, pushing bill: impairment, speeding, distraction, non-seat belt use, double fines related to these

Hawaii stats: 95 fatalities to 120 fatalities (numbers increased but percentage still relatively low)

Consumer Product Safety commission: David Cheng

- DHS regulation: some resistance due to facilities having to purchase new cribs
- Baby Box: popular in Finland given to all newborns from hospital; New Jersey just started state-wide; KMCWC looking into as option for families who don't have access to crib right away, in

committee for review/discussion, 18,000 births 10-20 deaths due to sleep related, 1/3 of mothers say baby is in safe sleep area;

- Concerns: lid, “putting my baby in a box?”
- Looking at most vulnerable
- CDR: Deaths occur with overlays, no place in room for cribs, Cribs for Kids have barriers
- David: alternative, agency does not endorse nor oppose it; Talking with other agencies using these boxes; box not subject to CPS standards; mattress doesn’t say meet flammable regulations; Recommended to tell industry not to leave elevated, or use lid; if CPS approved only saying no lead; good for 6-weeks baby depending upon growth; give only if education provided to baby;
 - Fidelity: offer to all families not just needy families; AND has to sign up for Baby box university
 - Cribs safest product, and can last longer
 - Does hotel inspection unannounced, some cribs with no labels or old; will provide information, suggest play yards
 - They are not a regulated product.
 - To date, CPSC is not aware of any incidents associated with them.
 - CPSC does not endorse using these over a compliant crib/play yard.
- CPS doesn’t test products coming in, but will provide information to businesses re: product safety

Sports Safety: Lisa Dau and Dr. Jen King

- Concussions – total 803
 - Football #1, cheerleading, girls soccer, girls basketball, girls v-ball
- HHSAA: pitch count only for baseball not softball, limiting number of pitches per pitcher in 4-day period, smaller schools affected; concern: kids play for different leagues with different pitch counts
- Free concussion clinic for parents 4/13 6:00 Kalani HS;
- 7/15 Concussion summit QMC docs and trainers:
- Return to Learn program for schools (post-concussion), academic adjustments
- Coaches required to do in person or online training
- Parents do beginning of sport, within consent

Maternal Child Health Branch-DOH: Helene Kaiwi

- Partnering with injury & prevention, addressing with child abuse and neglect: train HVs with
- Child & abuse specialist started Katherine Sorensen.
 - Prevent Child Abuse Hawai’i will be running pinwheel campaign,
 - bonding with families, reading to children on military families
 - looking into work with families with children w/disability and homeless
- ACES training/ HV conf- advanced training on Kaua’i, looking to expand statewide
- Training provided on Safe sleep, Period of Purple crying
- Concern about new national impact of new administration on Home Violence (HV)
 - HV-Network Advocacy group: comprised of all providers, some participants going to DC; Nat’l Head start coalition requesting double funding when funding ends, 9/17; need to show efforts in collecting local funding (current 3 mil in HI); need to inform local legislation of importance of funding

- Safe sleep: plays video in Ewa center, average 75 people per day reached; providing training on infant toddler staff
- Safe sleep flyers in Chuukese/Marshallese available, will provide to hospitals and community
