CAN I VOTE?

If you're 18 or over on Election Day, a U.S. citizen and registered, **YES!!** Make sure your registration is up to date and all your information is correct. **Register by Oct. 13.**

ON THE BALLOT

Two Constitutional amendments:

Redistricting Changes process for redrawing political boundaries every 10 years.

"Yes" creates new redistricting commission of citizens and state legislators to draw districts.

"No" maintains state legislature control of redistricting.

Vehicle property tax relief for 100% disabled veterans

"Yes" One vehicle will be exempt from state personal property tax

"No" No tax relief

VOTE EARLY THIS YEAR - NO EXCUSE REQUIRED

Vote absentee by mail

- Request your absentee ballot now - no later than **Oct. 23.**
- To request an absentee ballot online, you'll need your Virginia driver's license and social security number.
- Ballots mailed out starting 9/18. Vote your ballot; a witness is not required. Put it in the supplied envelope and sign the envelope.
- Mail back or hand-deliver to your ballot drop off station as soon as possible. If mailed, ballot must be postmarked by **Nov. 3** and received by noon Nov. 6.
- Use the Virginia Elections Online Portal to track that your request has been received and your ballot has been mailed and returned.

Vote early in person

Early voting in person begins **Sept. 18.** Voting locations open Monday-Friday and on the two Saturdays preceding the election (Oct. 24 and Oct. 31). Bring your ID (see below). Curbside voting/ballot drop off station available.

New voter ID rules — photo ID no longer required

- Acceptable ID: Virginia driver's license, voter registration card, utility bill, other documents containing your name and address, employer-supplied ID with photo or college-issued student ID.
- Voters who do not have an acceptable ID may sign an ID confirmation statement.

ELECTION DAY TUESDAY, Nov. 3 from 6 am – 7 pm

Curbside voting/ballot dropoff available. Don't forget your ID!
