


Create a design for a billboard that will be on a very busy highway in your city.







In a sentence, you will often find a main verb that tells the action and another verb, called the **helping verb** (or auxiliary verb) that helps the verb be more precise. There are 23 helping verbs that are usually grouped as follows:

Group 1: is, am, are, was, were, be, being, been

Group 2: has, have, had

Group 3: do, does, did

Group 4: shall, will, should, would

Group 5: may, might, must, can, could
