

SCORING RUBRIC

For proposal reviews for the transfer of the Kirby Smith statue from the National Statuary Hall Collection.

How to use this rubric:

Committee members will receive a copy of the rubric to help ensure as fair and unbiased a proposal selection process as possible. The scoring mechanism defines each of the four criteria scored by committee members: Presentation, Applicant Qualifications, Appropriateness to Site and Maintenance. Benchmark descriptions and corresponding point values are listed to serve as a guide in the scoring process.

Weak	Makes an incomplete and/or inadequate case for selection of the location. Information is confusing, unclear, and lacks specific details.	0
