MRDC has hired Juanita Farrington, an early education leader for over twenty years, who will facilitate access to training, educational programs, and professional development as appropriate on an individual basis, helping teachers and staff identify and apply for the scholarships and grants available for this purpose. Additionally, MRDC will be able to enhance its workforce development efforts by recruiting interested parents to serve as interns within the program while becoming certified in early childhood education.

"Our teachers and parents want to seek educational opportunities that make job advancement possible," said Marisol Rodriguez, MRDC's Head Start director. "This new staff member will help connect parents and staff with the opportunities they are seeking, and help us fulfill our mission more fully than ever."
