Fr. Cody's Corner

Things found in the Sanctuary

During Mass we use three different kinds of cloths for specific purposes: the corporeal, the purificator, and the hand towel or manutergium.

The Corporeal. The Corporeal is a square piece of white linen that the paten, chalice, hosts, and wine are placed upon. By placing the unconsecrated hosts and wine on this cloth, the priest is indicating the bread and wine that will be consecrated in this Mass. Patens, chalices, hosts, and wine are required to be placed on a corporeal for the Mass. The word corporeal, as the name implies, comes from the word for body, corpus. This cloth contains or holds the Body of Jesus. Think of it this way. The body of Jesus was wrapped in a white linen before being placed in the tomb. The same happens here. The bread and wine are placed on a white linen before they become the Body and Blood of Jesus. The corporeal is folded in three parts twice. This ensures that any additional crumbs that may have fallen onto the corporeal during the consecration are contained in the cloth folds.

The Purificator. As the name implies, these linens are used to "purify" or clean the vessels during Mass. The first use of the purificator is to wipe the chalice after someone has drunk from it. The second use is to assist the priest in purifying the vessels at the conclusion of communion. The third use is to absorb extra consecrated wine should some happen to spill. They can also be used to absorb extra oil from sacramental use. These cloths are rectangular in shape and usually have a small red cross on the top fold.

The hand towel or the manutergium (manutergia pl.). Manutergium is Latin for hand towel. This linen has the simple purpose of drying the priest's hands after the washing of the hands rite during the Mass. These towels are rectangular in shape and have a little red cross on the front.

# ANNOUNCEMENTS

The following are the new restrictions for reopening

- Mass attendance is limited to 30 families to maintain the 6 ft social distancing standard and to provide the most people we can, given this restriction.

- The offertory basket will be placed on the gifts table at the entrance to the church. Please place your contributions in that basket on your way in.
- The sign of peace and receiving the Precious Blood from the Chalice are both dispensed.
- Everyone is required to receive communion in the hand and the kneelers for receiving communion are removed.

Finally, the aisle is marked with 6 ft markers to indicate the distance you must stand from the person in front of you.

**Adoration is Back!!**


With the restriction on the number of people who can attend Mass, Bishop Vetter encouraged all parishes to offer additional times for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament to allow people to pray and experience the effects of the Eucharist. Therefore I am offering additional times for you to pray before our Lord in the Eucharist. Many people are confused about Adoration. I generally schedule an hour of time for Adoration. You are welcome to come to the whole hour or just part of the time. Even 5 minutes is worth the effort. The main part of the rite happens in the first 5 minutes and the last 10 minutes. So, if you wanted to experience Benediction, or the blessing with the Eucharist, come for the last 10 minutes of Adoration. I will have cards with the prayers and hymns available.

The CARES Act has made additional funds available to end Veteran homelessness in Montana and Wyoming.

In an effort to get more Veterans off the streets, to help Veterans at risk of becoming homeless, and to minimize the population of congregate settings (Shelters and Grant Per Diem facilities) the Veterans Administration has provided nearly three million dollars available for Veterans living in Montana and Wyoming through the Supportive Services for Veteran Families program, operated by Volunteers of America.

Along with the funds comes temporary qualification and rule changes: re-enrollment of Veterans previously exited from the program, a temporary waving of the enrollment limitation length, changes to the limitations for transitional accommodations before permanent housing is found, and an allowance for a COVID-19 friendly remote intake process.

Veterans who are currently or are facing imminent homelessness should call Volunteers of America at 1.844.4.VOA.Vet to speak with a service coordinator today.

Volunteers of America, with a mission to help those in need, operates Supportive Services for Veteran Families in every county of Montana and Wyoming to ensure those who served the country are cared for with programs to empower them to build happy and healthy lives. Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. staff are available in Billings, Bozeman, Great Falls, Helena, Kalispell, and Missoula, Montana, as well as Casper, Cheyenne, Gillette, Riverton, Rock Springs, and Sheridan, Wyoming.
