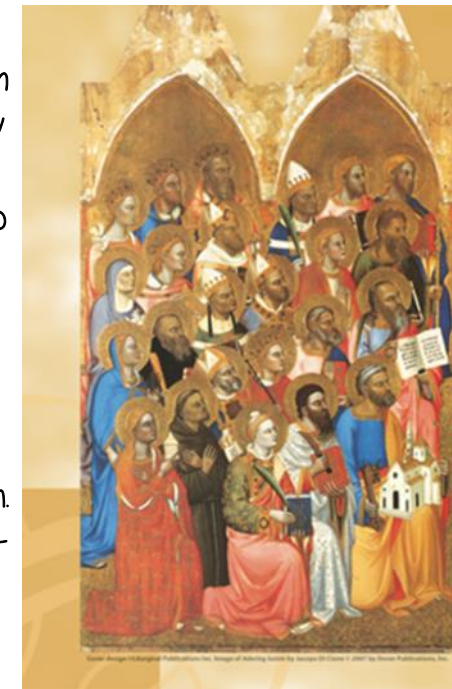

With Fall Fest cancelled this year the Food Pantry may not be able to fulfill the needs of families that need help.

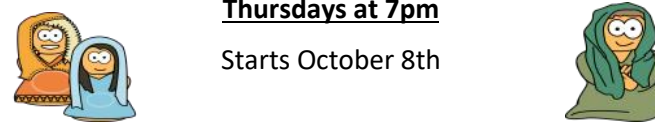
