

**Description of the County Board's Role
In the Provision of the Ohio Statewide EI System Components**

Service Coordination by Crossroads		LCBDD/Deepwood Board Role
1.	Outreach/Child Find/Family Support Services	The Lake County Board of DD/Deepwood collaborates with the Crossroads' Early Intervention Services regarding Child Find, Family Support events and outreach.
2.	Capacity	Based on the Board's annual planning, resources and priorities, the LCBDD/Deepwood has a capacity to serve 152 infants and toddlers.
3.	Specialized Services in Everyday Routines, Activities and Places	Based on the Board's annual planning, resources and priorities, the LCBDD/Deepwood provides services to infants and toddlers Birth to Three. Families will have access to a (PSP) Primary Service Provider and a core team. Service will be provided in natural environments, including the home and community settings.
4.	Prenatal Home Visits	The Catholic Charities' Program is responsible for all prenatal home visits.
5.	Ongoing Home Visiting Services.	The Catholic Charities' Program is responsible for all ongoing home visits.
6.	Intake/Evaluation to Determine Eligibility	Central Intake and Referral is managed by Bright Beginnings of Cuyahoga County. The referrals are sent to Crossroad's Early Childhood Services where they are assigned to a Crossroads' Service Coordinator, who is a part of the LCBDD/Deepwood' Early Intervention core team. The core team is responsible for intake, evaluation, family assessment and the teaming process to determine eligibility.
7.	Service Coordination/(IFSP) Individualized Family Service Plan Development and Review	The Crossroads' Service Coordinator, with parent consent, is ultimately responsible for IFSP development and IFSP reviews for all eligible families. However, the LCBDD/Deepwood EI personnel will actively engage in the team process, including participation in the Evaluation Team Meeting for the purpose of developing the (IFSP) Individual Family Service Plan, for the review of the IFSP and for annual redetermination.
8.	IFSP Implementation	The LCBDD/Deepwood EI Program will provide resources and supports to all enrolled children/families from the Board's available services, as written in each IFSP.
9.	Ongoing Assessment for Program Planning	The LCBDD/Deepwood Early Intervention Program is responsible for ongoing assessments, at least quarterly for IFSP review and, annually, for redetermination, as required by the rule for each child eligible for Part C that is enrolled in their program.
10.	Transition	The Crossroads' Early Childhood Services and the (LEA) Local Educational Agency will coordinate the transition process. The LCBDD/Deepwood will provide support and information specific to the transition of the child turning three or from the Ohio Statewide Early Intervention System at any time.
