On Tuesday this week we had a fantastic sports day organised by Mrs Dodd. The children had a fun start to the morning by completing a carousel of activities in their individual classes, competing in their colour groups. After a short break, the children competed in class races on the school field. There was a lot of cheering in support of the teams. I hope you all enjoyed looking at the photographs on tapestry.

On Wednesday morning, the children moved up into their new classrooms to meet their teacher for September. It was lovely to see the newbies coming up the class 3 stairs, some of them for the first time. The year 3 pupils enjoyed being able to tell them all about life in Class 3. The children in year 4 came back very excited from Class 4, so I think they are looking forward to their time there.

Maths – this week we have worked on translation of shapes of a grid.

Science- this week we have continued with our topic on electricity. We have been finding out about insulators and conductors. We have also been thinking about how much we rely on electricity in our lives and what life would be like without electricity.

We are encouraging as many families as possible to get involved.
