## SCHEDULE

### Exhibition Rules

1. One Entry only per exhibitor per class
2. Exhibits in all classes MUST be the work of the exhibitor and/or been in his/her possession for at least two months
3. The judges' decision is FINAL in all cases
4. Exhibitors in the Flower and Floral Art sections must provide their own containers
5. The Committee will take every possible care of all exhibits but will not be liable or held responsible for breakages or damage to said exhibits
6. Any complaint must be made in writing by 4.00 p.m. on the first day of the Show
7. Exhibits in Divisions D,E,F and G must not have been previously shown in the Village Show
8. Exhibitors MUST reside, work or be a member of a club in the Bishopsteignton/Ideford Parish. Family members of Exhibitors are also eligible to enter

### DIVISION 'A' Flowers

1. **Dahlia** - any kind, 1 specimen bloom (not pompon)
2. **Dahlias** - vase of 3 different kinds (not pompons)
3. **Dahlias** - 3 heads floating in a bowl of water
4. **Dahlias** - vase of 3 decorative
5. **Dahlias** - vase of 3 cactus and/or semi-cactus
6. **Dahlias** - vase of 5 blooms, one type, any kind
7. **Rose** - 1 specimen bloom, large flower (HT)
8. **Roses** - vase of 3 blooms, large flower (HT)
9. **Rose** - 1 spray of Cluster-flower (floribunda)
10. **Fuschias** - 4 heads on a board with stems in water (double flowering cultivar/s)
11. **Fuschias** - 4 heads on a board with stems in water (single flowering cultivar/s)
12. **Chrysanthemums** - 5 stems
13. **Vase of Annuals** - 5 stems, 2 varieties
14. **Penstemons** - vase of 3 stems
15. **Vase of Mixed Garden Flowers (NOT Chrysanthemums)**
16. **Top Vase.** Vase of mixed flowers containing between 5 and 10 stems taken from a minimum of 2 different **KINDS** of plants (**NOT** two varieties of same plant). No accessories, seed heads or berries allowed; only foliage attached to stem of each flower allowed. **Vase to be viewed from the front.** The exhibit will be judged out of 20 points. Condition and quality 8 points; colour and texture 6 points; balance of presentation 6 points. Winners are awarded prize money of 1st - £5, 2nd - £3 and 3rd - £2
17. **Hydrangeas** - vase of 3 blooms
18. **Shrubs** - Vase of 3 different kinds (need not be in flower)
19. **Gladiolus** - 1 specimen spike
20. **Vase of Perennials** - 5 stems, any variety or varieties
21. **A cactus or Succulent** - in pot not to exceed 152mm (6 ins.) diameter
22. **Geranium / Pelargonium** - in pot not to exceed 200mm (8 ins.) diameter
23. **Bonsai** exhibit
24. **An Orchid** - in pot not to exceed 200mm (8 ins.) diameter

25. **House plant** - foliage, in pot not to exceed 200mm (8 ins.) diameter
26. **House plant** - flowering, in pot not to exceed 200mm (8 ins.) diameter

#### **DIVISION 'B' Fruit and Vegetables**

27. **Runner Beans** - 9
28. **Onions** - 3 grown from seeds, stands allowed
29. **Onions** - 3 grown from sets, stands allowed
30. **Shallots** - plate of 6, any kind, sand on plate allowed
31. **Potatoes** - 3 round or oval
32. **Beet** - 3 of one variety
33. **Courgettes** - 2 (no larger than 150mm / 6 ins. in length)
34. **Tomatoes** - 5 ordinary cultivars
35. **Tomatoes** - 5 of small fruited cultivar
36. **Carrots** - 3 of one variety
37. **Herbs** - fresh, culinary, 3 in water
38. **Any other vegetable** - not enumerated above
39. **Vegetables** - collection of 5 different kinds, one specimen of each i.e. 1 potato, 1 tomato etc stands allowed.
39. **Apples** - cooking, 3
40. **Apples** - dessert, 3
41. **Plums** - 3
42. **Raspberries** - 12 with stalks
43. **Fruit** - a plate of any kind not enumerated above
44. **Top Tray**. A display of three types of vegetables from this list of eight. The points value of each vegetable required for the display is given in brackets. 3 Carrots (long 20pts/ short 18pts); 3 Beetroot (long 20pts/ round 15pts); 3 Onions (20pts); 3 Parsnips (20pts); 6 Peas (20pts); 3 Potatoes (20pts); 6 Runner Beans (18pts); 6 Tomatoes (18pts). The vegetables are to be displayed within an area of 18ins x 24ins (45 x 60cm) without bending any part of them. No part of the exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. Parsley is allowed as a garnish only. Foliage must be trimmed, Onions tied or whipped, stands allowed. Winners are awarded prize money of 1st - £5, 2nd - £3 and 3rd - £2

#### **DIVISION 'C' Floral Art - 'Pop from the Past'**

##### **Prize Money 1st - £3, 2nd - £2 and 3rd - £1**

An exhibit means plant material with or without accessories. In all classes no artificial plant material may be used unless stated. Artificially coloured plant material may be used unless otherwise stated. Bases, drapes and background may be used.

**RECIPES**

**MEN ONLY**

**CHEESE STRAW BUNDLES**

100g butter and some for greasing the baking sheet  
150g mature cheddar  
100g plain flour and some for dusting work surface  
1 egg yolk

**Method**

Heat oven to 220°C / 425°F / Gas 7  
Grate the cheese, sift in the flour, rub in the butter with fingertips.  
When it is a crumbly mix add the egg yolk and gather into a ball.  
Dust the work surface with flour then roll out the mixture to a square 5mm thick.  
Cut out two rings using pastry cutters smallest size and two sizes larger (1cm wide) and the remainder into strips, 1cm wide and approximately 10cm long.  
Bake for 8 minutes - check after 5 or 6 minutes.  
They should be pale golden brown.  
Once out of the oven, leave for 5 minutes before trying to remove.  
Assemble into two bundles with three straws inside each ring.

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**LEMON DRIZZLE CAKE**

8 oz Margarine (+ extra for greasing)  
6 oz Caster Sugar  
6 oz Self-raising Flour  
2 eggs  
3 extra ounces of Caster Sugar  
1 Lemon

**Method**

Heat oven to 175°C / 350°F / Gas 4. Cooking time approximately 30 minutes  
Cream margarine and sugar, add beaten egg, grated lemon rind and fold in sifted flour.  
Spread in oblong greased 2lb tin and bake until firm to the touch.

While baking squeeze lemon and mix juice with extra 3 oz of sugar in a jug.  
As soon as cake is cooked remove from oven and whilst still in tin immediately spoon over the lemon and sugar mixture.  
Leave in tin until cold, remove from tin and place on plate to serve.
