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<p>Exposure to COVID-19</p> <p>The virus is spread in minute water droplets that are expelled from the body through sneezing, coughing, talking and breathing. The virus can be transferred to the hands and from there to surfaces. It can survive on surfaces for a period after transfer (depending on such things as the surface type, its moisture content and temperature).</p>	<p>Everyone on site.</p> <p>General transmission may occur: Through close contact between coaches, participants and visitors</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Anyone feeling unwell or has someone in their household who is unwell informed not to attend games • Social distancing maintained through limited spectators • Hand sanitiser to become standard kit to be supplied by player/team • Officials, coaches, parents and visitors informed of the measures in place to reduce transmission. 	<p>High</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All Managers/players and officials to provide own hand sanitiser as standard kit – hands to be sanitised at start of game, during breaks and after game • Every team to appoint a Covid Officer to be responsible for track and trace info – collection of data for all friendlies manually, Matchday app to capture date once season commences – data to be stored for 21 days • Recommendation of 1 spectator per playing participant • No spectators allowed in perimeter of pitch fencing – only players, manager/ assistant/ respect marshall/first aider and match officials. Spectators responsible for their own social distancing measures outside of perimeter fencing • Social distancing of 1m+ to be adhered to wherever possible during breaks in play • No handshake before or after games • No team goal celebrations 	<p>Managers/officials</p>	<p>Low</p>



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	Coach and casualty. Transmission may occur when providing First Aid	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sanitise hands before and after treating a casualty. Wear disposable gloves and mask where there is a risk of respiratory droplets splashing due to repeated coughing or vomit. When performing CPR phone an ambulance and use compression only CPR until the ambulance arrives. 	High	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> First aiders instructed on the safe use of PPE. Disposable gloves and face masks to be provided as compulsory standard first aid items by all teams Any used PPE to be disposed on in the lidded bins available on site 	Managers	Medium
<p>Resuscitation Statement: It is likely that a child having an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest will be known to you. We accept that doing rescue breaths will increase the risk of transmitting the COVID-19 virus, either to the rescuer or the child. However, this risk is small compared to the risk of taking no action as this will result in certain cardiac arrest and the death of the child.</p>						



Risk Rating

The risk rating is used to prioritise the action required. Deal with those hazards that are high risk first.

Risk Rating	Description	Action Priority
High	Where harm is certain or near certain to occur and/or major injury or ill-health could result	Urgent action
Medium	Where harm is possible to occur and/or serious injury could result e.g. off work for over 3 days	Medium priority
Low	Where harm is unlikely or seldom to occur and/or minor injury could result e.g. cuts, bruises, strain	No action or low priority action
