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As population increases and industry grows, so does the demand for fresh water. The problem is that the supply of fresh water is limited and much of what is available becomes contaminated by pesticides or other pollutants; as the land becomes more crowded. Recycling 'used' water is one solution to the problem.

But many water treatment methods are either too costly or unsatisfactory. In an effort to make better use of this essential resource and allow poor countries to reuse their unclean water, some American companies are developing new water recycling methods which produce absolutely pure water at economical rates.

One such method was developed by scientists at the Florida Institute of Technology by treating impure water and even sewage* with radio-active cobalt. Gamma rays kill harmful bacteria and viruses in the water while avoiding any radioactive contamination. The water is then filtered and 'scrubbed' clean of all particles. "The result", says Dr David Woodbridge, physicist and co-inventor of the method, "is clear, pure and potable water".

***sewage**: waste water and human waste flowing from houses and other buildings to the sea
