

Maths 2 – word problems

Carla is making a sandwich. She has put 3 sardines on the bread but would like 8 altogether. How many more sardines does she need?

Buster has 3 satsumas in his lunch. Each one has 5 pieces. How many pieces does he have altogether?

When Natie opened her crisp packet there were 25 crisps in there. She has eaten 7. How many does she have left now?

Carla has decided to make sandwiches for Year 2. She will use two slices of bread per sandwich and there are 20 children in year 2. How many slices of bread does she need altogether?

Carla has a loaf of bread. It has 14 slices in it. Buster says she has enough for 8 sandwiches. Is he right? Explain your answer.

Challenge: Ms Page has one sandwich made of two pieces of bread, 3 slices of cheese and $\frac{1}{2}$ tomato every day. The bread comes in loafs with 20 slices in, the cheese comes in packets of 6 slices and the tomatoes come in packets of 3.

How many packets of bread, cheese and tomatoes should Ms Page buy every week?
