Use of changing and shower facilities must follow government advice on the use of indoor facilities;</p> <p>Players and officials should sanitise hands before and after a game as well as scheduled breaks throughout a game or</p>					
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		<p>training session;</p> <p>Each club for any match played must retain records of all personnel. The information must be retained in a safe place in accordance with Data Protection Act 2018. The information held by teams MUST be destroyed after 21 days.</p> <p>'Casual Spectators' that stop for 10 - 15 minutes do not have to give their details.</p> <p>Any kit worn by players MUST be retained and laundered by them and returned to the club for the next game.</p> <p>All equipment including goal post, corner flags etc. must be sanitised before and after the game.</p> <p>Ball handling should be kept to a minimum with most contact via a boot and the ball disinfected in breaks of</p>					
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			<p>play;</p> <p>Goal celebrations should be avoided;</p> <p>Equipment should not be shared, and goalkeepers should ensure they disinfect their gloves regularly in breaks in training or matches and thoroughly afterwards. Where possible, coaches should only handle equipment in training;</p> <p>Participants should follow best practice for travel including minimising use of public transport and walking or cycling if possible. People from a household or support bubble can travel together in a vehicle</p> <p>Before each match and training session the manager will ask all participants if they have displayed any symptoms of Covid 19 as per government guidance.</p>
