Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for being so supportive and co-operative with our return to school plans. We have had 3 very special days welcoming our children back to school and it has been wonderful to see so many happy faces from children, mums and dads, carers and other family members. The children look very smart in their uniforms but please ensure items of clothing like jumpers/cardigans/sweatshirts have their name on. Please remember that ear-rings should not be worn in school so if your child has recently had their ears pierced then please remove them as soon as possible. No other jewellery (other than a watch) should be worn.

We have reviewed our arrangements as they stand at the current time and feel they are working well with just a couple of minor adjustments for parents and carers to note which should hopefully ensure drop off and pick up times run smoothly.

- **Parents/Carers of Y4, Y5 and Y6 children**

If you have a child or children in Y4, Y5 or Y6 then, if possible, they should walk into school themselves. Their teacher or teaching assistant will be in the playground and will ensure they go into school safely.

At home time, when you come to collect your child/ren then come into the playground, collect your child/ren and go out of school through the gate nearest the Y6 classroom and straight onto Wolviston Mill Lane.

If you have younger children to collect Nursery/Reception/Year 1/Year 2/Year 3 you will need to continue around the one-way system to their classes and then out of school via the gate onto Wolviston Mill Lane as you have been doing this week.

- **Please observe social distancing requests**

We aim to have the children ready for you to collect so you do not need to wait for them. This will help ensure that there is a continuous flow of pedestrian traffic around school and should ensure that there is little congestion. If you are waiting, or if there are a number of people together, then please ensure you are keeping your distance from others. Thank you for your patience.
