Innovations in poverty alleviation

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Freedom Employability Academy (FEA) is an intensive education curriculum delivered in FEA classrooms to disadvantaged youth. The objective is to enable them pivot their career trajectories towards professional jobs.

FEA operates a network of 100+ branches located in low income neighborhoods in Delhi, Agra, Varanasi, etc. These provide a free year-long program, which is built around English, personality and non-cognitive skill development.

30,000+ students attend FEA classes every day. Most students are in the 15 to 22 year age group and are often first generation learners in their families.

FEA curriculum is based on best practices at top universities globally. Researchers from Stanford University are currently studying FEA for economic impact on poverty alleviation. MIT has funded professors at the Indian School of Business to evaluate FEA as a model for enabling disadvantaged Indian youth to learn. Researchers at the University of Texas are examining FEA innovations in the area of personality development and confidence building.

FEA Mentorship program: Most students from low income backgrounds do not personally know educated successful adults, who would take the time to speak with them and guide them. FEA organizes volunteer mentors from the Global Indian diaspora to conduct a once a month, one hour duration skype call with small groups of FEA students.
