Miss Davey, Y1-Y6 Councillors

1. Constitution and Expectations

As it was the first Student Council meeting of the year, Miss Davey read out the new Constitution and explained her expectations of behaviour and actions over the coming year. The new Student Council all agreed to follow these expectations and were looking forward to being role models to their year groups.

2. WWF Animal adoption

Miss Davey explained that as all classes have requested a class pet and this is not easy to do due to allergies and looking after the pet during holidays, instead, as we are an ECO school and we are always looking after the environment, so the previous Student Council had voted for an endangered animal to adopt through the WWF. They had voted for a Polar Bear and Miss Davey had received the adoption pack from the WWF, which she opened in front of the current Student Council. It included a cuddly toy and an information pack. The Student Council decided that they were going to run a school competition to name the Polar Bear and then it would be passed from class to class to be looked after.

3. Unicef Ambassadors/Outright Campaign

Miss Davey explained that Y6 candidates were going to prepare a speech with reasons as to why they should be Unicef Ambassadors to be presented to Student Council. They would then vote for their chosen candidate. These ambassadors would then lead Student Council and a Unicef working party through this year's Outright Campaign, celebrating the anniversary of the UNCRC, including assemblies, activities and letters to be written to local MPs.

4. Children in Need 2019

Student Council shared the ideas from their class meetings about dress up ideas and fundraising activities. Councillors shared suggestions:

- Y1 – yellow for Pudsey/Superheroes
- Y2 – Prince/Princess, Sports clothes, Looking like Jo Wicks, Superheroes
- Y3 – Sports clothes
- Y4 – Sports clothes/PE kits, camouflage, yellow clothes for Pudsey, Blush or Pudsey, Superheroes, PJs
- Y5 – Yellow spotty, Winnie the Pooh, Sports clothes, Each class in a colour from Pudsey's eyepatch
- Y6 – Sports clothes, Disney/Aladdin

Fundraising activities:

- Y1-Y3 - nothing
- Y4 – guess the number of sweets in a jar, spinning games, put the eye patch on Pudsey, roll the coin, bake sale
- Y5 – sponsored silence, sponsored wash the teacher's car, decorate/make a Pudsey eye patch, sweet/cake sale, decorate a biscuit, pass the parcel, BEPPA's Got Talent
- Y6 – cake sale, how many Smarties on a cake, sponsored run, tug o war – Teachers vs pupils, throw sponges at teachers, eat a donut/don't lick your lips contest vs teachers.

Councillors voted for Sports clothes and/or any colour from Pudsey's eye patch as dress up theme.
