



Religious Education Vision at Kingsway Primary School

At Kingsway the basis and development of our teaching and learning of RE, to ensure breadth and balance, is planned using the Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education 2016-2021 (Leicestershire SACRE). Through this, teachers are able to effectively plan learning opportunities that are appropriate for the needs, ages and ability of their pupils. RE is taught where possible as part of the creative curriculum (ICT, art, literacy) as appropriate or as a discrete subject once a week.

Although all pupils will learn from Christianity in each Key Stage, in addition we want the children at Kingsway to have a broad and balanced RE curriculum, where children will not only learn from the principal religions represented in the UK but also from our local and wider community. There are also opportunities for pupils during their time at Kingsway to also explore and learn about non-religious world views. Pupils are also able to explore British values in relation to religions and beliefs.

Our rolling programme along with the emerging, expected and exceeding outcomes in each unit ensure that learning outcomes and activities are carefully planned to meet pupils' different ages and abilities in mixed year classes.

The emerging, expected and exceeding outcomes also allow teachers throughout the year to track children's progress in the three key aims of knowledge, understanding and skills.

Through RE we want the children at Kingsway to be able to explore big questions about life, find out about what people believe and what differences this makes to how they live, so pupils can make sense of religion, reflecting on their own ideas and ways of living.

At Kingsway, we want the children to be challenged to think rigorously, imaginatively, creatively and respectfully about their ideas in relation to religions and world news.
