Brack – a Be-Ro recipe as follows:-

Ingredients

225g sultanas
110g raisins
110g currants
175g demerara sugar
150ml tea, hot
1 egg
225g SR Flour

Method

1. Mix together the dried fruit, sugar and hot tea.
2. Cover and leave overnight.
3. Preheat oven to fan 150C or conventional 170C.
4. Grease and line the base of a 1kg loaf tin.
5. Add the egg to the fruit mixture, beat well & then stir in the flour.
6. Place mixture into loaf tin and bake for 1.5 to 1.75 hours or until firm.
