<p>Have a go at learning a dance! A nice simple repeat is the Macarena, or Saturday night!</p> <p>Date:</p>	<p>Make a nursery rhyme scene You can do this as a picture or a collage! For example, Humpty Dumpty falling off the wall surrounding by Kings Horses and men.</p> <p>Date:</p>	<p>Learn the Bare Necessities song from the Jungle Book. You can use a lyric video to help with the words.</p> <p>Date:</p>
<p>Explore dynamics in a song (singing or playing loud and quiet, and anywhere in between!)</p> <p>Date:</p>	<p>Practice 'Hello to all the children of the world' that we sing in assembly.</p> <p>Date:</p>	<p>Explore tempo in songs (singing or playing faster to see if it's more difficult, you can do this on youtube by changing the speed in settings).</p> <p>Date:</p>
