| <p>Reading focus Intro: Phoneme Power Point Fastest Finger first Main: Year 1 Phase 5 Bingo Reception Phase 4 Bingo Plenary: Phonics tracker website (games)</p> | <p>Read the story Pirates love Underpants (see PP) – look closely at the pirate ship. Does it look comfortable? Could you live there? What do you think it needs?</p> <p>Design/draw their own pirate ship thinking about what they would like in it. Label the features of the ship and discuss why they have chosen each part. (Example on lesson support)</p> <p>Watch cbeebies Night Pirates https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=mdWxBn-xvrQ</p> | <p>Counting on: Counting on Powerpoint Start by looking at the addition calculations on the first slide. Explain to the children that today they will be doing some adding- and learning to do something called ‘counting on’ using a number line. Show them how you would solve these problems by counting on- so when working out their total they don’t need to count from 1 each time but can instead find the first number in the calculation on the numberline and then count on.</p> <p>Work through the rest of the Counting on powerpoint and solve the word problems together.</p> | <p>Learn the song about pirates http://learnenglishkids.britishcouncil.org.cn/node/1688</p> | <p>Pirate/Non- Pirate Sort Look at pictures of clothes and objects on the Pirate Sort PP for parents. Which ones belong to a pirate? Everything had been sorted but Mrs Mitchell’s cat Roo ran across and messed it all up. Can you help sort it into the correct sections?</p> <p>Use the Pirate and Non Pirate Sort and Sorting Grid to sort the items into pirate/non pirate.</p> |

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| <p>Reading Focus</p> <p>Intro: Phoneme Power Point Fastest Finger first</p> <p>Main:</p> <p>Easier: Real/Alien Phase 2/3</p> <p>Harder: Real Alien (Year 1 phonemes)</p> <p>Plenary: Phonics Play (games)</p> | <p>Re-read the story of Pirates Love Underpants. Read a letter from Pirate Pete (Lesson Support) explaining that they have an important dinner to celebrate getting the Pirate Pant Trophy back and need some help planning a menu.</p> <p>Write a menu for the pirates (Starter, Main and Pudding)</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-when-i-was-one-i-sucked-my-thumb/zhbyt39 Continue to learn the pirate song</p> | <p>Counting back</p> <p>Listen to/sing the song '10 Green Bottles' to help you think about counting backwards from 10-0. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TOooQv7oHvw</p> <p>Perhaps you could think about pausing the song each time a bottle falls and writing a number sentence e.g. 'we started with 10 bottles and then 1 fell down... 10-1=9'. You could then change the number of bottles that falls down each time, to make it even trickier!</p> <p>Complete the Taking Away worksheet</p> | <p>Listen to the theme tune to pirates of the Caribbean</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6zTc2hD2npA</p> | <p>Parrot Pet</p> <p>What is a pirate without a parrot on their arm!</p> <p>We are going to make our own pet parrot. You will need a toilet roll tube with holes through the bottom, pipe cleaner/ string/ wool, something to decorate your parrot with (felt tips, collage materials etc)</p> <p>1st we need to decorate our parrot and make it as colourful as possible, adding eyes, feathers etc.</p> <p>2nd we need to carefully thread the pipe cleaner through the holes and the tie them into a twist to make a bracelet.</p> <p>3rd put it on your wrist and give it a name.</p>  |

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| <p>Writing Focus</p> <p>Intro: Phoneme Power Point</p> <p>Main: Easier: CVC/CVCC/CCVCC read and write (word write)</p> <p>Harder: Alternative spellings (words)</p> <p>Plenary: Phonics websites</p> | <p>Re-Read Pirates Love Underpants encouraging your child to join in as you go along. What do we think of the book? What do we like about it? What is our least favourite part? How many stars would you give it?</p> <p>Year 1 – Use the template to write a book review for Pirates Love Underpants.</p> <p>Reception – Give the children the starter sentence – My favourite part was...My least favourite part was... and they complete them. Ask them to give it stars out of 5.</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-when-i-was-one-i-sucked-my-thumb/zhbyt39</p> <p>Continue to learn the pirate song</p> | <p>Digging deeper with counting on and counting back</p> <p>Have 5 cubes/objects laid out on a table . Ask the children to remember this number (5). Then cover over the cubes so they can't be seen any more. Explain to the children that you are going to add 2 more cubes and put them under the cloth. Can they estimate how many cubes we will have now, by counting on from 5? Uncover the cubes and check if they were right. Repeat this a few times, adding in or removing a different number of cubes from under the cloth each time.</p> <p>Complete the adding more worksheet</p> <p>Extension- go through the Changing the Unknown powerpoint</p> | <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p05d1r88 - links to pirate programmes on cbeebies</p> | <p align="center"><u>Make some Pirate Playdough</u></p> <p>You are going to have a go at making your own playdough, but not just any playdough, sparkly, gold pirate playdough! This is a simple recipe that doesn't involve any cooking.</p> <p>Have a look at the recipe at the link below: https://momspotted.com/2015/02/make-gold-treasure-pirate-playdough-recipe-fun-crafts-mom.html</p> <p>Once you have made the playdough, can you use it to make:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Gold coins? A treasure chest? A pirate ship? A parrot? |

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| <p>Intro: Phoneme Power Point</p> <p>Main: Easier: Write sentences using words from Wednesday</p> <p>Harder: Write sentences using words from Wednesday</p> <p>Plenary: Phonics websites</p> | <p>Children to help re-read the story Pirates Love Underpants – can we recall what happened at the beginning, middle and end? Children to create their own story map using the template provided.</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b0b952d0/hey-duggee-series-2-49-the-sailing-badge</p> <p>Watch Hey Duggee - sailing badge.</p> | <p>Teen numbers 11-20</p> <p>Ask your child to write 17, 15 and 12. Talk about what teen numbers (11-20) have in common (always start with a 1- which is worth one 10).</p> <p>Complete the teen numbers worksheet, writing the correct number next to each set of numicon.</p> <p>Get children to practice any teen numbers that they form incorrectly.</p> | <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p05d1r88 - links to pirate programmes on cbeebies</p> | <p>Make a Treasure Chest</p> <p>Using a six-segment egg box, you are going to create a treasure chest. Paint and decorate the treasure chest, making it as decorated as possible. Then you could have a discussion around this- what do you think pirates keep in a treasure chest? 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| <p>Tricky words Intro: Tricky Word Power Point Tricky word quick write</p> <p>Main: Easier: Tricky Words (some or come) Write 2 sentences using your tricky word.</p> <p>Harder: Easy Learn Sheet (find the words) Write 2 sentences using your tricky word.</p> <p>Plenary: Phonics tricky word game (phonics tracker)</p> | <p>Show some pictures of the story all muddled up, is this is the correct order? How have I got it wrong? (Lesson Support)</p> <p>Children to have a set of pictures from the story and cut and stick into the correct order.</p> <p>Ext: Begin to retell the story</p> | <p>Teen number ordering</p> <p>Have some sheets of paper with the numbers 11-20 (one on each sheet). Encourage the children to help you to put them in the correct order to make a number line.</p> <p>Ask them to close their eyes, then mix up a couple of the numbers/take one of the numbers out/put another number in e.g. 41 instead of 14- can you spot the mistake and tell me how I can correct it?</p> <p>Complete the 1 more and 1 less teen numbers worksheet.</p> | <p>Complete the yoga on YouTube. Row row row your boat version (about 3mins long). https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=e9T0lu89LI8</p> | <p><u>Create own treasure hunt around the garden/park.</u></p> <p>Hide some of your toys around the house or in your garden.</p> <p>Can you write a set of clues for a family member to help them find them in a specific order?</p> <p>This might help you to start you off...</p> <p>Clue Number 1 You might find the first doll in the place where we eat breakfast?</p> <p>Clue Number 2 (hidden with the first toy) Well done. I bet you can't find the next clue. It is hidden where you rest your head.</p> <p>Now have a go at writing your own set of clues.</p> |
