## Spellings

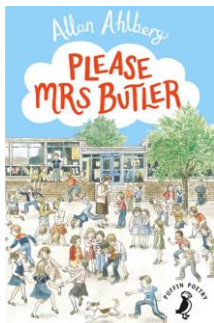
In your Oak National Academy lessons above, there is a spelling focus (ei words) and then a test (on Lesson 5).
