Go back through the first few pages of the book and pick out some examples- e.g. dark, little, nice, brave.</p> <p><b>Activity:</b> Children design/draw the monster/ogre/gremlin that they think is outside Tom's house (page 5), and</p> <p>Easier: write some adjectives to describe their creature</p>	<p>Week 9 White rose Maths Counting to 100 <a href="https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/">https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/</a></p> <p><b>Introduction</b> Watch white rose lesson 1 and then practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.</p> <p>Put a selection of objects (skittles, smarties etc) on a table – how can we count them? What is the best way? Group them into sets of 2 – How many sets of 2 are there? Repeat with sets of 5 and 10 – which is the easiest way to count large amounts of objects?</p> <p><b>Main</b> <b>Complete Monday Sheet</b></p>	<p>Think about something you really want to achieve this week. Write it down and try and achieve it (for example, I really want to tidy my bedroom)</p>	<p><b>Handwriting</b> Choose from the selection of <b>letter formation sheets</b> encourage your child to complete them slowly and ensure they are forming letter correctly.</p> <p><b>Spellings</b> In class we are practising the Tricky words (on the Tricky Word mat). We are learning to write them within sentences to check our knowledge.</p> <p><b>Reception spellings:</b> her, they, do, you, into Can you put these into sentences?</p> <p><b>Year 1 spellings:</b> looked, could, for, by, hear Can you put these into sentences?</p>

It addresses the importance of keeping your private parts to yourself and being able to say NO in uncomfortable situations. It builds on previous learning about kind touching (holding hands, playing games, giving hugs) and unkind touching (scratching, kicking and hurting others).</p> <p>Watch the video Pantosaurus <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-1L07JOGU5o">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-1L07JOGU5o</a> and discuss the importance of being able to say no if you are uncomfortable.
