

### **Routines for September**

# General - Please see website for video of drop off and collection.



- There will be a one-way system in operation for entry and exit to the site that must be observed to protect all concerned. ENTRY to the site will be via the Trinity Road pedestrian entrance only.
- There will be no opportunity for contact between parents and teachers at the beginning and end of day and any need for communication will be via email. enquiry@coppice.bham.sch.uk
- Visitors to the site are being restricted so no early collection or late drop off can take place unless it is an emergency.
- The site will be closed to everyone between 9.15 and 3.00. Access during this time will be via the pedestrian gate next to the vehicle gate and only in an emergency.
- Children will need to wear uniform as normal.
- Children will be encouraged to have their own pencils and stationery etc so pencil cases are encouraged from year 3 upwards. These must not be shared with other pupils.
- Lunches will operate as normal children in reception, year 1 and year 2 will receive a free school meal and all others can purchase as normal or bring sandwiches. Hot lunches will be provided as normal.
- Squirrels will be operating before and after school and the children will be kept in their year group bubbles whilst with them. See website for details.
- It is hoped that after school clubs will be able to operate but in year groups so as to allow for the bubbles to be continued.
- A CHILD MUST NOT BE SENT TO SCHOOL SHOULD THEY BE DISPLAYING ANY OF THE CORONAVIRUS SYMPTOMS
  - o Persistent cough
  - o Raised temperature
  - Loss of taste or smell
- WHERE A CHILD DISPLAYS SYMPTOMS IN SCHOOL, PARENTS WILL BE CONTACTED AND ASKED TO COLLECT THEIR CHILD IMMEDIATELY. You should then arrange for your child to be tested.
- Should any member of the bubble be diagnosed with the virus, all members of the bubble will be sent home and asked to isolate for 14 days.


#### **Drop Off**

- RE, 1W, 2KS, year 6 and year 4 should arrive between 8.35 and 8.45.
- RM, 1S, 2M, year 5 and year 3 should arrive between 8.50 and 9.00.
- Reception, year 1 and year 2 will be dropped off at the classroom door parents then continue along the path and round on to the playground and out through the wooden gate behind the Octagon onto Dower Road exit.
- Year 3 and year 4 will enter through the door at the bottom of the glass staircase and parents should leave them at the green gate and then exit via the Dower Road Path.
- Year 5 and year 6 will enter through the back entrance to school and parents will continue round onto the playground and out through the wooden gate behind the Octagon onto Dower Road exit.

#### Collection

- RE, 1W and 2KS will be collected at 3.15 from the classrooms please wait outside the classroom whilst socially distancing.
- RM, 1S and 2M will be collected at 3.30 from the classrooms please wait outside the classroom whilst socially distancing.
- Year 6 will be collected at 3.15 and will be dismissed from the hall doors please wait in the car park whilst socially distancing and exit via the pedestrian gate next to the vehicle gate.
- Year 4 will be collected at 3.15 from the playground please stand in the zone allocated to your class (4W Zone A and 4C Zone B) and the children will be delivered to you.
- Year 5 will be collected at 3.30 and will be dismissed from the hall doors please wait in the car park whilst socially distancing and exit via the pedestrian gate next to the vehicle gate.
- Year 3 will be collected at 3.30 from the playground please stand in the zone allocated to your class (3CS Zone A and 3IR Zone B) and the children will be delivered to you.

If you have children in different drop off/collection times we would ask you to adhere to the correct times until we review how the system is working – many thanks. To avoid congestion, please do not arrive earlier than your allocated slot.



# First Week Back - Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> to Friday 4th

As the children will be returning to their old teachers and classrooms for the first three days back, the routine will need to be different for these three days!

On these three days **ONLY**, come at the times above for **your new** year groups but drop the children with their old teacher on the playground and then exit via the wooden gate behind the Octagon onto Dower Road.
