The Importance of Pupil Premium Grant funding

The government introduced the Pupil Premium to support the progress of children.

The decision to use the numbers of children in receipt of Free Schools Meals as the eligibility criteria made this an effective and cost efficient way of calculating the amount and delegating these funds to schools to support all children who may be at risk of underachieving at school.

Principles

The Pupil Premium Grant helps Donnington Primary School to:

- ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of our pupils
- ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed
- make provision for socially disadvantaged pupils
- recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals.
- use the Pupil Premium Grant funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Allocate Pupil Premium Grant funding following a needs analysis that identifies priority classes, groups or individuals.

Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at any one time

| Curriculum Support Material (CGP) | £590 | To ensure that all Y6 have access to additional study resources regardless of ability to fund these within the family | All Y6 chn had access to these support materials |
| SMT – Teachers | £11,000 | Teachers time with various interventions to work with individuals, groups and in class to support children at risk of under achieving | A number of teachers and senior teachers offered support programmes which let to good progress |
| Themed workshops/Art Therapy | £6,000 | To work with groups to help pupils gain confidence and make progress | The input of therapies support individual children deal with issues so that these issues had less impact on attainment and progress. |
