1. APOLOGIES

Apologies had been received from Cllr B Wallace, Mrs W Woo and Borough Cllr. T Tilbrook

2. MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF 29 MAY 2017

The Minutes of the meeting of 29th May 2017 were approved and signed by the Chairman

3. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF 29th MARCH 2017

There were no matters arising.

4. REPORT BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

The Chairman highlighted various issues and events from the previous year including further Daffodil bulb planting. She thanked Mr and Mrs Rogerson who had organised the Christmas quiz which raised £240 for village amenities. The Village Sign was due to be refurbished that year, the contractors had agreed to hold the price quoted in 2016. The War Memorial would also be cleaned. She thanked the Ffolkes for allowing the Parish Council to continue to meet without charge, the new Clerk and Cllr Tilbrook for their support. The sewage programme had been delayed but after some disruption should be up and running by the Summer.

5. REPORT BY A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE P.P.C.

Mrs Jan Newell, PCC Treasurer, thanked everyone involved with the Church. She thanked the Parish Council for its donation of £850 towards the upkeep of the churchyard but asked that it consider increasing its financial support for the forthcoming year. She outlined Church expenses and income and submitted accounts for the record.

6. REPORT BY A REPRESENTATIVE OF CALLIBUT'S CHARITY

Mrs Kate Sayer, Trustee and Administrator, gave the report and stated that the 2017 distribution stood at £1485.00 and had been allocated to 13 single senior people; 3 married couples and the Hillington and Flitcham Good Companions. Mrs Sayer would be pleased to receive information from anyone who was eligible to benefit.

7. REPORT BY A REPRESENTATIVE OF GOOD COMPANIONS

Pat Cox, Secretary, submitted a written report which was made available at the meeting. 2017/18 saw outings to the Grimston Good Companions, The Hawk and Owl Trust, and the 6 Churches Blossom and Yarn event. Harvest Festival had been held at the Ffolkes as well as the November Bingo. New members were very welcome.

8. REPORT BY A REPRESENTATIVE OF TAPPING HOUSE:

No report given.

9. OPEN DISCUSSION

Concern was expressed about the surface of the A148 through the village after the sewage works which caused both noise and vibration. A complaint was made about the noisy manhole cover in the A148. C.Cllr said that the cover would be replaced with a heavy-duty version which was on order. Mention was also made of the reduced bus service through the village. No details were available on the mobile Post Office service.

The meeting closed at 8.15pm.
