COSHH assessment for cleaning beer lines

Assessor – Ceri Heldreich

Date reviewed – 23rd November 2019

Hazards identified

Substance – Super 5L Purple Beerline Cleaner, which is used to clean beer-dispensing equipment.

Hazardous properties – Harmful by skin contact / corrosive

Quantity – use weekly in line with manufacturer's recommendation

P Statements :-

P280 – Wear protective gloves and clothing / eye protection and face protection.

P301/P330 & P331 – if swallowed, rinse mouth. Do NOT induce vomiting

P303/P361/P353 – if on skin (or hair), take off contaminated clothing immediately and rinse skin with water / shower.

P303/P351/P338 – if in eyes, rinse cautiously with water for several minutes, remove contact lenses if present and easy to do – continue rinsing.

P337 & P313 – if eye irritation persists get medical attention / advice

Emergency procedure:-

Eye contact – Remove affected person from source of contamination. Remove any contact lenses and open eyelids wide apart. Continue to rinse for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention immediately

Inhalation – Remove affected person from source of contamination. Keep affected person warm and at rest. Get medical attention immediately for breathing difficulties.

Skin contact – Remove affected person from source of contamination. Remove contaminated clothing. Wash skin thoroughly with soap and water. Get medical attention promptly if symptoms occur after washing.

Ingestion – Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Give plenty of water to drink. Do NOT induce vomiting. Get medical attention immediately.

Spill procedure – Do not directly touch the spilled material. Absorb with blue paper towel and place in bin liner then remove to the bin in the compound. Flush the contaminated area with plenty of water.

Methods of prevention or control of exposure

Access control:-

Lines to only be cleaned once a week by bar staff trained to do so and only use amount and dilution as recommended by the manufacturer.

Approved PPE:-

Eye protection – wear tight fitting chemical splash goggles.

Hand protection – wear protective gloves – neoprene, nitrile rubber, polyethylene, polyvinyl chloride

Skin and body protection – wear appropriate clothing to prevent any possibility of skin contact.

Disposal procedures:-

Environmental hazard – concentrate waste is classified as hazardous waste

Waste class EWC code 06 02 04

Aquatic Chronic 3 – H412

Avoid creation of any environmental contamination by only using very small diluted volume. Used cleaner to be flushed with copious amount of water. Empty containers to be rinsed out and disposed of in the bin in the compound.

Training requirements:-

Line cleaning to be carried out by the bar manager only wherever possible. Training for new bar managers must be carried out.

Handling and storage requirements:-

Store in a tightly closed original container in the beer cellar and store away from acids.

COSHH assessment for cleaning products used in cleaning kitchen, bar area, showers and toilets

Hazards identified

Substances – Flash Bleach Spray, Flash Professional All Purpose Cleaner 5L, cif Cream, Chef's Larder Antibacterial Cleaner

Hazardous properties – Not regarded as a health or environmental hazard in normal use.

Quantity – use all products in line with manufacturer's recommendations

Risk Phrases :-

R36/37/38 – irritant – irritating to eyes, respiratory system, and skin

Emergency procedure:-

Eye contact – Rinse thoroughly for several minutes. If symptoms persist seek medical advice.

Inhalation – Go in open air and ventilate suspected area. Get medical attention immediately for breathing difficulties.

Skin contact – Rinse affected area with water. If needed apply cold compress to relieve irritation. If symptoms persist, discontinue use of product and seek medical advice

Ingestion – Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Give plenty of water to drink. Do NOT induce vomiting. Get medical attention immediately.

Spill procedure – Do not directly touch the spilled material. Absorb with blue paper towel and place in bin liner then remove to the bin in the compound. Flush the contaminated area with plenty of water.

Methods of prevention or control of exposure

Access control:-

Use sparingly and only use in well ventilated areas.

Exposure / PPE:-

Not a hazard in normal use but recommend wearing gloves when using

Disposal procedures:-

Consumer products ending up down the drain after use. Observe safe handling precautions

Training requirements:-

These products do not require any special training before use.

Handling and storage requirements:-

Store in cool dry area – cleaning store in the Committee Room.
