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Vision and Aims

Our vision at Emmbrook Junior School is to ensure all our pupils have the confidence, understanding, knowledge and positivity to lead a healthy and active lifestyle through the eyes of Physical Education and Sport.

- To Provide all the resources and knowledge for pupils to improve in all aspects of Sport and PE
- Ensuring pupils enjoy productive and inclusive PE Lessons
- To Provide ample sporting activities through Breakfast, Lunchtime and After School
- Increase skill sets to challenge and compete in School representation
- To give the opportunity for **ALL** children to represent the school in various sports and competitions

Evaluation

2018/2019 has been an excellent and exciting year at Emmbrook Junior School for all aspects of PE and Sports. The school entered in to 15 sporting tournaments, 4 leagues (Football, Rugby, Cross Country and Cricket) competing in over 28 matches across the leagues and several festival days.

Emmbrook has on going relations in organisation of the Wokingham School Cricket League, Wokingham District football leagues, 6 Nations Tag Rugby and the TVRL Cross Country events.

165 (68%) of all pupils at Emmbrook Junior School attended either a Lunch time club or after school club with **114 (48%)** representing the school in sporting fixtures.

28 (55%) of PPG and SEN children attended either a lunch time club or after school club with **9 (18%)** representing the school in sporting fixtures

63 (54%) of all girls at Emmbrook Junior School attended either a lunch time club or after school club. A girl's only football team was created and entered in to a league and tournaments. As well as this in both Rugby and Cricket there had to be a minimum of 2/3 girls within the main team

Moving forward we will be looking to enter in to more tournaments that can give different opportunities to children and entering the Wokingham Schools Netball League to increase our skillset and offer children a different sport to represent the school in. As well as this we want to focus on Girls and B team fixtures across the sports, this allows more children to represent the school and increase their confidence, skills and sense of achievement.

An 'achievements' wall has been created by the PE Notice board to celebrate all the children who have achieved a sporting accolade outside of school. Giving the children a sense of pride and to show all other pupils their personal achievements.
