- Increase skill sets to challenge and compete in School representation
- To give the opportunity for **ALL** children to represent the school in various sports and competitions

### Evaluation

2019/2020 is a year no school will ever forget with the impact of Covid-19. The below information includes that of the 2 terms of school in which we were able to participate in sporting events/fixtures and perform Physical Education with no restrictions.

Emmbrook has on going relations in organization of the Wokingham School Cricket League, Wokingham District football leagues, 6 Nations Tag Rugby, Wokingham Schools Netball League and the TVRL Cross Country events.

We competed in over 14 Matches and 10 events/tournaments.

68% (165) of pupils at Emmbrook Junior School attending a sporting after school club

48% (114) of pupils represented Emmbrook Junior School in sporting events.

55% (64) of girls at Emmbrook Junior School attending a sporting after school club

36% (42) of girls representing Emmbrook Junior School in sporting events.

55% (28) of SEN children at Emmbrook Junior School attending a sporting after school club.

18% (9) of SEN children representing Emmbrook Junior School in sporting events.

58% (15) of BAME children at Emmbrook Junior School attending a sporting after school club.

38% (10) of BAME children representing Emmbrook Junior School in sporting events.

Emmbrook Junior School were participating in the School Games mark accreditation. Unfortunately, due to Covid-19 the accreditation has been paused/postponed until the new school year.

Through SPARTAN club the school were able to attend our very first Inclusive Sports Festival which was directed at SEN children only.</p> <p>* Increased participation in competitions and matches with the introduction of the Wokingham Schools Netball league. This was the first time the school has entered in to a competitive Netball league.</p> <p>* Pupils are more confident and willing to try new sports showing strong attitudes and a desire to better themselves when it comes to sport. We have seen increases in clubs such as Tag Rugby and Netball rather than the usual Football and Athletics.</p>

Extra sessions were given to children on an alternative weekly rota.</p> <p>*As well as organising Sports Day (which was done virtually this year), Emmbrook Junior School also run the Wokingham School Cricket league and a Cross Country Race (this year's race was held at Cantley Park for over 350 children). As well as this, Emmbrook assist with the running and organization of the Six Nations Tag Rugby league and the Wokingham District Primary Schools football league</p>
