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Introduction

The Main Objects of the Sambhavna Trust as listed in the Trust Deed are as below :

- The main object of the Trust is the welfare of the survivors of the Bhopal Gas Disaster through medical care, research, health education and information dissemination.
- To provide appropriate medical care through modern medicine as well as Ayurved, Yoga and other alternative therapies to a community of worst affected survivors.
- To generate information on health consequences of the gas exposure and to educate the survivors on preventive and curative measures.
- To carry out medical research that address the current and projected medical needs of the survivors.
- To provide health education and counseling to the community of survivors.
- To publish medical and other information related to the Bhopal Gas Disaster for public information and education.
- To function as a repository of medical and other information on the Bhopal Gas disaster and make such information accessible to the survivors and to the general public.
- To promote and support initiatives by the survivors for greater health awareness and for a healthy environment.
- To relate with medical relief and research activities of Government and other Agencies with reference to the survivors of the Bhopal Gas disaster.

In fulfillment of these objects the following five activities are carried out at the Sambhavna Trust Clinic that is situated in the middle of the area most severely affected by the Union Carbide Gas Disaster on December 2-3, 1984.

Activities of the Sambhavna Trust Clinic

1. Medical care
2. Growing and Manufacturing medicines
3. Community Health
4. Research and Monitoring
5. Documentation

1. Medical care

1.1 Registration

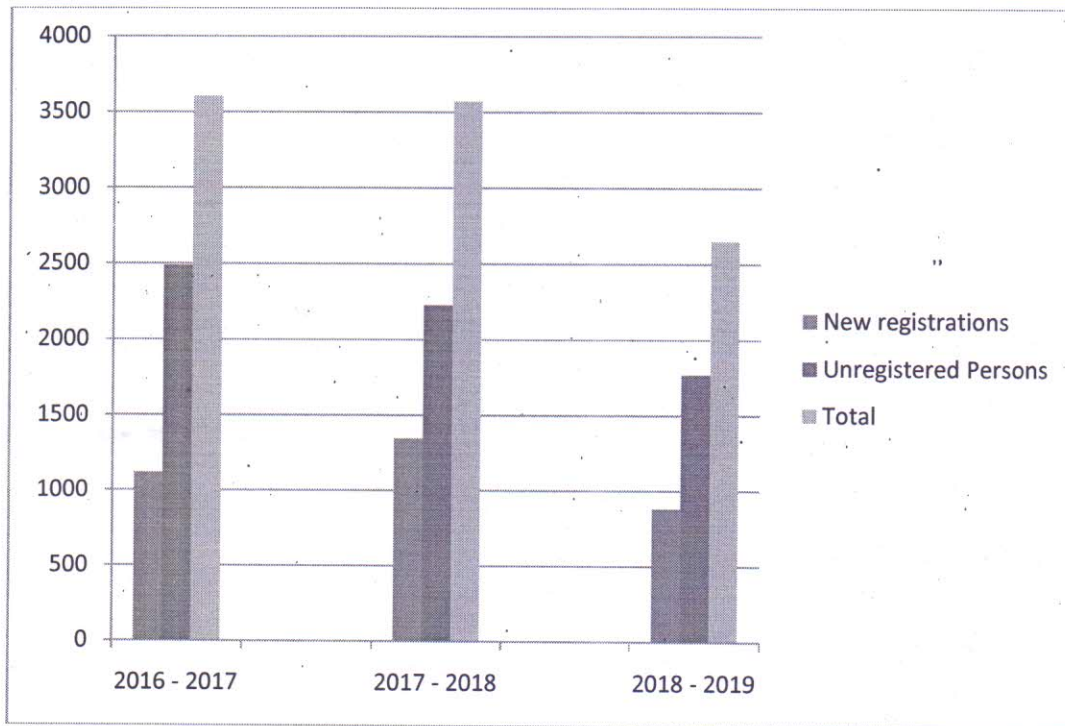
All persons who have documentary proof of being exposed to Union Carbide's toxic gas or contaminated ground water for at least six months who require treatment for a month or more at the clinic are eligible for registration at the clinic. Persons who do not have the required documents are registered for long term care after verification of their exposure from neighbours by the Clinic's community health workers. Persons without the necessary documentation are also offered short term care at the clinic as Unregistered persons. The persons name, age, address, occupation, income and other details are recorded at the registration. Weight and height of the person registered for care is also measured periodically. Three staff members work in the Registration Unit and enter personal and clinical data on to the centralized medical information system.

Below we present information on the Registered and Unregistered persons who received care at the Sambhavna Trust clinic in different years from April 1, 2016 to March 31, 2019.
