NOTICE IS GIVEN that we are applying to the Consistory Court of the diocese for permission to carry out the following:

1. To confirm investigatory works into the cause of movement noted on flagstones around the rear of the church, the Chancel and in the Sanctuary and to churchyard drainage, and the renewing of a drain to an existing soakaway to the south-east of the chancel, as previously authorised by interim faculties granted on 22 May 2019 and 25 March 2020 (as extended).
2. Compaction of existing fill beneath the sanctuary and relaying of existing stone surface on a reinforced limecrete slab with graded stone sub-base.
3. Relaying of individual floor slabs, levelled and bedded in lime mortar, in six locations within the body of the church.
4. A new length of drain to a new soakaway to the north-east of the chancel.

All in accordance with Stuart C Holland drawings nos. 944/02 and 944/03 Revision B, and Specification and Schedule of Works dated September 2020 (revised January 2021).

### **Directions to petitioner**

You must display this public notice (or a copy of it) for a continuous period of not less than 28 days, not counting the day on which it was put up or the day on which it is taken down, (or for such other period as the Court may direct and subject to any special directions of the registrar) in each of the following places:

1. on a notice board or in some other prominent position inside the church; and
2. on a notice board outside the church or in some other prominent position (whether on the outside of the church door or elsewhere) so that it can be read by the public.
