INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting relating to (i) the granting to the Directors of a general mandate to repurchase and issue Shares; (ii) the extension of the Issue Mandate to include shares repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate; (iii) the re-election of retiring Directors; and (iv) the notice of the Annual General Meeting.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 2 June 2017, the Shareholders passed a resolution to grant a general mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. It is therefore proposed that approval from the Shareholders be sought at the Annual General Meeting to grant a general mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares not exceeding 10% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company, as at the date of the passing of such resolution. GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE NEW SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 2 June 2017, the Directors were granted the mandate to allot and issue Shares up to 20% of the then issued share capital of the Company. The Existing General Mandate is due to expire at the Annual General Meeting.

The Board proposes to seek an approval from the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting for the grant to the Directors of a general mandate to issue new shares representing up to 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution in relation thereto. The Issue Mandate will lapse on the earlier of (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting to be held in 2019; (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles or any applicable law to be held; and (c) the date on which the authority given to the Board is revoked or varied by passing in an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in a general meeting.

This is an explanatory statement given to all Shareholders relating to a resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting for approving the Repurchase Resolution. This explanatory statement contains all the information required pursuant to Rule 10.06(1)(b) and other relevant provisions of the Listing Rules which is set out as follows:

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised of 1,803,558,784 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the Repurchase Resolution and on the basis that no Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting, the Company is entitled under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 180,355,878 Shares.

2. REASONS FOR SHARES REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Mandate is in the interest of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole which enables the Company to repurchase Shares on the Stock Exchange as and when required. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or its earnings per Share.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASE
