



CALL FOR POSTERS

Digital Ethics Student Competition

Competition

If you are an undergraduate, graduate or postgraduate student, you are invited to submit a poster under the broad theme of “*Digital Ethics: can we do better?*”.

The *ethical topics of interest* include, but are not limited to:

- Autonomy (including autonomous vehicles, robots, drones, etc.)
- Bias, fairness and transparency: when algorithms make decisions (including AI)
- Privacy (including face recognition, tracking, online work, etc.)
- Safety and security

Each poster should focus on a specific *domain of interest* of the student. We welcome submissions in domains that include, but are not limited to:

- Academia
- Crime, law and policing
- Environment
- Entertainment (including video games, music, cinema, etc.)
- Finance
- Health
- Social Media
- Military
- Transport

Posters should present the student’s opinion on a digital ethics issue for which they have strong views that they wish to share. The poster should make reference to secondary material (academic papers, general media, social media, videos, etc.) which the student believes represent relevant and different views on the subject.

As a conclusion, the poster must address the issue of whether/how educators could better inform students on digital ethics. The main target audience are teachers (working in higher-level institutes and in/for industry).

Prizes

The 3 best posters will be selected for presentation at the [3rd Ethics4EU online Workshop](#) (hosted by Telecom SudParis) on the 15th June, 2021. The presentations must be 5 minutes long (the students will be assisted by academic staff to prepare for this). All conference attendees will be invited to vote on the 3 presentations, with prizes awarded during the closing remarks at the end of day. Prizes will be awarded to the student presenters:

- 1st Place: 1000€ gift card
- 2nd Place: 750€ gift card
- 3rd Place: 500€ gift card

Submission Guidelines

Submissions must include:

- Poster
- Name, title, email address, and organization of presenter(s)
- Short Bio for each presenter (maximum 300 characters)

They should be submitted using the template available in [the download section of the dedicated webpage](#) as a .pdf by email to ethics4eu@gmail.com

Evaluation Criteria

The following criteria will be used to select posters proposals:

- The clarity of the presentation
- The importance of the digital ethics problem chosen
- The personal view of the student
