

HEALTH & SAFETY

Prior to sending children to camp, please check for any unwanted pests. Head lice love to travel between the different schools as we get together!

Sleeping accommodation is in Westray Baptist Kirk, which has fire alarm cover.

We do not intend to take part in any dangerous activities and therefore risk assessments have been written with this in mind. We do intend to visit the beach during the week and no children will be left unsupervised.

Several staff on the team have current First Aid certificates however in the event of any more substantial medical treatment being required, children will be taken first of all to the Westray surgery who have been informed of the camp.

All children attending the camp will require to have a parental consent form signed notifying leaders of any recent surgery, known allergies, ongoing treatment, medical conditions and restrictions on treatment. Parents must also consent to emergency medical or surgical treatment including the administration, where necessary, of a local or general anaesthetic.

Please let us know if there is any reason why staff at camp may not apply sun lotion/cream to your child or children

With respect to child protection, Kirkwall Baptist Church has a Safeguarding Officer and Policy, and members have undergone safeguarding training. In the event of any query or issue arising, the camp leader will be the first to be informed and will then take a decision as to how the matter should be dealt with. The Safeguarding Policy is available on request and camp staff have PVG certificates. Parents will be informed at the earliest appropriate opportunity of any significant incident.

AGE RANGE

Summer Camp is for those about to start Primary 4 (minimum age 8 years old) up to those about to start S2. As usual younger children may come as day visitors if their parents are present as camp leaders or by special arrangement.

FEES & SPENDING MONEY

This year's camp fees are £60 per child. Where two or more children are coming from a family, a reduced rate of £50 for subsequent children applies. Day visitors pay £10 per day including the cost of activities and meals. Fees should be paid in advance and cheques made payable to "Kirkwall Baptist Church". Fees can also be paid on the first day but if paid in cash please write the child's name on the envelope.

If children are bringing any substantial amounts of spending money, we recommend these be placed in safekeeping and therefore we will be operating a camp bank during the week. While all reasonable precautions will be taken, unfortunately the camp cannot be responsible for personal money going missing during the week that has not been placed in the bank.
