## Letter from the Executive Director

What an incredible time to be a part of Camp Solomon Schechter! As you will read in this Annual Report, our first in many years, attendance continues to grow, the Camp is fiscally sound and we have been working hard to improve both the camp grounds and summer programming. Through our partnership with the Grinspoon Institute for Jewish Philanthropy, we successfully participated in two Challenge Grant opportunities (raising more than \$600,000 for capital improvements and operations) and strengthened our leadership and infrastructure.



And this is just the beginning. With a solid foundation in place, we have great plans for Camp's future. The most ambitious idea involves a potential capital campaign to build a new *Chadar Ochel* (dining hall and kitchen) and an indoor multi-purpose/sports facility. As most of you know, our current *Chadar Ochel* can no longer adequately accommodate all of our campers. The multi-purpose/sports facility will allow us to provide a full spectrum of activities regardless of the weather, as well as expand our ability to host other groups throughout the year.

Through our ongoing partnership with the Grinspoon Institute for Jewish Philanthropy, we will launch a Legacy Program to ensure the financial stability of Camp well into the future. We will continue to find ways to bolster our summer programming, primarily in the areas of sports and the arts, and we plan to increase and diversify our campership by launching an Israel program and by growing our scholarship fund so no child is denied the joy of attending Camp.

## Introduction

Camp Solomon Schechter, founded in 1954, is the premier Jewish camping experience in the Pacific Northwest. Our Shabbat-observant and Kosher camp is independent, rooted in Conservative Judaism. Camp offers an innovative Jewish experience for youth of all denominations. While our largest numbers of campers come from Washington, Oregon and British Columbia, we also serve Jewish communities in California, Nevada, Idaho, Alaska, Alberta and many other locations, including Israel.

Camp is located one hour from Seattle and two hours from Portland.

Our spectacular 170-acre wooded facility features breathtaking views of our private lake, where campers can swim and paddle boat. Hiking in the untouched beauty of our own forests and protected wetlands augment our exciting outdoor program. We also have our own campsite along the banks of the Deschutes River.

At Camp Solomon Schechter, we emphasize the values of integrity, *derech erez* (respect) and *tikkun olam* (repairing the world). We do this through sports, *omanut* (arts) and *teva* (nature) to create our ideal Jewish community. Camp builds Jewish identity and commitment, raises self-confidence, develops decision-making skills, improves social skills and enables campers to reach inside themselves and discover talents and abilities they never knew they had.



## ACA Accreditation

The Board of Directors and staff of Camp Solomon Schechter are proud to announce that, as of October 2011, we are an American Camp Association (ACA) Accredited camp. ACA Accreditation means that Camp has passed a thorough review of its operations – everything from staff qualifications and training to emergency management. The ACA collaborates with experts from the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American Red Cross and other youth-serving agencies to ensure that current practices at Camp reflect the most up-to-date, research-based standards in camp operations. Camp Solomon Schechter and the ACA are excited to form a partnership that promotes summers of growth and fun in an environment committed to safety.



## Summer in Review

Camp Solomon Schechter had another amazing and successful summer. We renovated boys cabins 3 & 4 and girls cabins 1 & 2 and began renovations on girls cabins 3 through 6. Camp attendance increased by 5% over the previous year, bringing the percentage increase since 2008 to nearly 27%. We also partnered with some key donors to start the Israeli Camper Fund, which enabled us to bring 12 Israeli campers to Gimmel session.

We revamped our *Limmud* (Jewish education) program for Gimmel session. In the past we had a one-topic focus, with all campers learning the same thing in grade-based groups. This year, staff members offered a variety of topics about which they were passionate, including Strong Jewish Women, Jewish Cooking and The Israeli/Palestinian Conflict. The campers then chose their favorite topics. The response from both staff and campers was incredible. – “This is awesome! Why didn’t we do this before?”



## Cornerstone Fellowship Program

Once again, Camp participated in the Cornerstone Fellowship Program, led by the Foundation for Jewish Camp, with generous support from the AVI CHAI Foundation. Five of our staff members became Cornerstone Fellows, and Ran Sommer, Boys Side Director, agreed to be the Cornerstone Liaison. They attended a conference in Pennsylvania in May, where they had the opportunity to learn from some of the best Jewish educators and camp staff in North America. During the summer, they put their passion and knowledge into leading alternative services and organizing two fantastic evening programs.

## Israeli Scouts

We hosted four *Tzofim* (Israeli Scouts), who spent the summer forging connections with the campers through *Yom Israel* (Israel Day), *Israel chuggim* (activities), leading Flag every morning, teaching *Peulat Yehudit* (Jewish programming) and being a part of daily Camp life. This gave campers the opportunity to befriend someone from Israel, get a true view of Israeli life from people close to their own age, learn about the issues that Israel faces and gain a deeper understanding of the Jewish state.

## Alfred & Tillie Shemanski Trust Fund Special Programming

Camp Solomon Schechter is always committed to top-quality, innovative special programming, and this summer was no exception. For the second consecutive summer, we treated our Gimmel campers to a performance and discussion with Jewish reggae and rap superstar, Matisyahu. We also hosted two Jewish musical artists to enrich our arts programming, Sheldon Low and Naomi Less. Our Bet campers were thrilled that professional soccer player Craig Tomlinson came for a week to co-teach our soccer *chuggim* (activities) and run Camp’s first World Cup Soccer Tournament, which is sure to become an annual event.





## Zip Tour & Challenge Course

Our Challenge Course, now in its second year of operation, has been a wonderful addition to the Camp program. This year we added a Zip Tour, which was a huge hit. Every camper experiences the Challenge Course and Zip Tour at least once during the summer. We have found that, in addition to being great fun, these experiences provide many other benefits to our campers, including increased self-esteem, team building and improved relationships with staff and other campers – three core Jewish values.

## Arts

One of our major goals for the summer was to significantly improve the arts program while maintaining our high-quality informal Jewish education focus. We hired Lynn Sommer, our first Arts Director, and gave her carte blanche to revolutionize the arts at Camp. She created new *chuggim* (activities), including a DJ *chug*, camp beautification, set design and a capella; revitalized old *chuggim*, such as our drama *chug* (which performed selections from “Fiddler of the Roof”); and introduced *Yomanut*, an entire day devoted to the arts. During arts and crafts, our Echad and Aleph campers decorated their own *mezzuzot* to bring home.

## Sports

Camp’s already strong sports curriculum blossomed into a true sports education program. Our staff members worked hard with the three licensed school teachers on staff to create lesson plans for every *chug* (activity). This enabled campers to not just have a fantastic time playing sports at Camp but also to learn some skills they could take home. We also introduced the Camp Solomon Schechter World Cup of Soccer and the Staff World Cup, which were run by our special guest, former Seattle Sounder and professional soccer player, Craig Tomlinson. More than 70 campers in Bet session participated in our camper version of the World Cup, which was a huge success.

Having completed the program, our Odedim alumni now have the opportunity to be the first participants of Camp’s new Israel program, which debuts in the summer of 2012.



## Open House

Our annual Open House, always held on the second Sunday of Bet session, was a wonderful success despite the drizzle. After the gates opened at 12:30pm, parents, campers, friends and alumni poured in to experience a taste of Camp. Attendees ate a great barbeque lunch, participated in an auction for two beautiful *tallitot* (handmade by Wendy Schwartz) and then watched the “Schechter Show.” Highlights included songs performed by each grade, a speech from Sam Perlin, a staff member flying over the audience on the zip line and the introduction of Rabbi Joshua & Goldie Stampfer, who founded Camp Solomon Schechter nearly 60 years ago.

## Israel Program

Camp Solomon Schechter is thrilled to announce the launch of our new Israel program, designed to create memories and friendships that will last a lifetime. The inaugural trip will take place during the summer of 2012 and is planned to be a five-week adventure beginning and ending at Camp. The group will travel throughout Israel, reaching every corner of the country. Campers will stay at youth hostels, hotels, kibbutzim and in the desert. This program will allow us to create a life-changing experience for our campers and provide an exciting transition from being an Oded to becoming Camp staff.

## Odedim

After being an Oded (counselor in training) staff member last year, Caitlin Dane returned to Camp Solomon Schechter as the Oded Director, bringing new ideas to add to the
