The Lake Wynonah POA COVID-19 Green Phase Plan

The Lake Wynonah Board of Directors is pleased our Community is moving to the COVID-19 Green Phase of the Governor's Re-Opening Plan. Our Green Phase begins Friday, June 19, 2020.

Community Pool

- To help keep our Community safe, Lake Wynonah will continue to follow the PA Department of Health's capacity guidance for our Pool during this Phase. At this time, Guests are not permitted. The Board will monitor pool attendance and re-evaluate on an ongoing basis.
- There will be one gate for entering, and one gate for exiting, the pool area. Please use the appropriately designated gate and follow social distancing guidelines.
- Members and Residents must provide their own chairs, umbrellas and towels.
- Staff will clean pool area ladders, counters, and restrooms for approximately 15 minutes daily at 2:00 p.m., 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Members and Residents may be asked to exit the pool and/or restrooms at these times. Due to the difficulty in keeping it sanitized, the Slide shall remain closed.
- Refreshments will not be available for purchase. Members and Residents are welcome to bring their own, but please do not share food and drink. No alcohol shall be permitted.
- Swimming lessons are not available.
- Water aerobics classes are still available on Monday through Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and again from 10:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Classes are limited to 9 people and are available on a first come, first serve basis. Donations for the instructor are welcome.

Playground Areas

All playground areas throughout the Community will open on Friday, June 19, 2020.

The Lodge

The Lodge Committee met on Monday, June 15, 2020, to discuss re-opening plans. Based on the capacity restrictions provided by the Governor, the Committee concluded it would be best for the Lodge to remain closed until capacity size increases or returns to full capacity. Staffing is not adequate to perform the required sanitary cleaning. The Board of Directors allocated funds to the Lodge Committee to install a sink to provide staff a location for a hand washing station. The Lodge Committee will continue to monitor guidance from the PA Department of Health along with the CDC guidelines for restaurants/pubs/clubs to determine the right time to re-open the Lodge. Customer and staff safety remain the Lodge Committee's top priority.

Civic Association

The Lake Wynonah Civic Association is pleased to announce their next meeting will be held on Thursday, July 9, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. in the basement of the Business Office. Social distancing guidelines are to be followed and masks are required.

Conclusion

The Board encourages all Staff, Members, and Residents to practice social distancing guidelines, good hygiene (frequently washing hands with soap and water) and respiratory etiquette. Please wear a mask, as feasible, but not while swimming as they may be difficult to breathe through when wet. Please remain at home if you are not feeling well. Masks are required when conducting business at the Business Office. Gatherings of more than 250 people are prohibited.
