***Welcome Back – Reopening
 At Saint. Dominic Parish***

Saint Dominic Parish is welcoming parishioners back this week-end with three regularly scheduled Masses in church plus a special outdoor Mass Saturday evening.

Since the provincial reopening announcement allowed little time to plan, the Saturday 5 p.m. evening Mass will be broadcast online via our website www.saintdominic.ca at 10 a.m. Sunday. This will be the final St. Dominic Mass to be broadcast for the pandemic.

In concert with Ontario's accelerated Step-One reopening, attendance at the regularly scheduled Masses will be limited to 15% of church capacity – 75 souls at St. Dominic. Overflow seating – beyond the 75 limit – will be available in the parish centre areas.

Because the Region of Halton removed specific guidelines for 'Places of Worship,' in place under the colour-coded framework, the Hamilton diocese is in agreement that Contact Tracing/Active Screening at St Dominic Mass are no longer required. Thus, we move forward under the provincial rules which do not mandate contact tracing at religious services. Ushers will continue to greet parishioners upon arrival as well as guide the congregation's movement during Communion and dismissal. Of course, we are all still required to abide by all of the Worship Safe protocols, including the wearing of face masks and social distancing which have been practiced at St. Dominic throughout the pandemic.

Outdoor Mass

For those who have been concerned about personal health during the past months, the outdoor Mass is a great opportunity to attend Mass in a safer way. The Mass takes place behind the church with full audio thanks to a parishioner's timely donation. Parking will be in the school yard with entrances on the west and east perimeters. Chairs will be set up with 2 meter spacing. Participants must wear face masks and are not permitted to remain in their cars during Mass. If possible, congregants are asked to stand during the consecration. Ministers of Holy Communion will distribute the Eucharist directly to people.

Weather permitting, evening outdoor Masses are currently planned at St. Dominic for the three Saturdays June 12, June 19 and June 26.

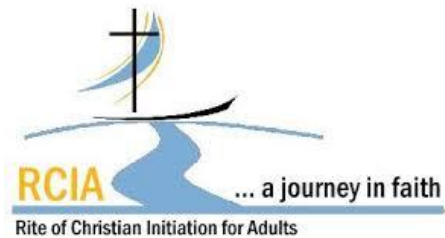

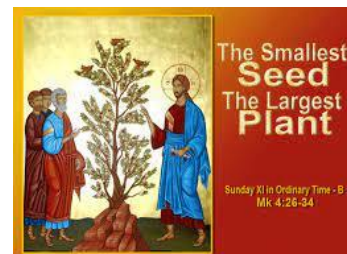
