



Brownland Farm

Guidelines and Actions for its Competitions and Facility to resume under current Social Distancing and other Federal, State, and Local Requirements. (Updated October 5, 2020)

This is a working draft that will continue to be updated as we receive updates and information from the USEF Federal, State and Local authorities, and/or other official sources. We provide this in order to ensure the safest environment possible when horse shows resume. The following Policies and Rules must be adhere to when on Brownland Farm premise. Failure to follow the Policies and Rules may result in expulsion from the show grounds.

In order to enter Brownland Farm grounds, you must be able to assure management that neither you, nor anyone in your household:

- Have you been in close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days? (Note, this does not apply to medical personnel, first responders, or other individuals who encounter COVID-19 as part of their professional or caregiving duties while wearing appropriate PPE.)
- Are you experiencing a cough, shortness of breath or sore throat?
- Have you had a fever in the last 48 hours?
- Have you had a new loss of taste or smell?
- Have you had vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours?

PRIOR TO ARRIVAL

ANYONE WHO EXHIBITS SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 OR HAS BEEN IN CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO HAS TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 WITHIN THE LAST 14 DAYS CANNOT ENTER BROWNLAND FARM PROPERTY!

The USEF Waiver/Release, USEF Federation Entry Agreement, and the Brownland Farm Release must be completed and emailed (or faxed) to the horse show office. Note that the USEF forms

Complete entry forms in their entirety with appropriate signatures and SSN/Tax ID!!

Provide an emergency contact for all participants.

Ensure all USEF information is complete and up-to-date. This includes USEF/USHJA memberships, microchip recording with USEF and USHJA registered, and Safe Sport (for all trainers, riders, owners that are 18 and older).

USE OF FACILITY

ANYONE WHO EXHIBITS SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 OR HAS BEEN IN CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO HAS TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 WITHIN THE LAST 14 DAYS CANNOT ENTER BROWNLAND FARM PROPERTY!

Any vehicle or trailer entering the competition grounds is subject to being stopped for inspection and proof of admittance.

Current copies of the COVID-19 competition guidelines will be available online and outside the show office.

Complimentary masks will be available for those who do not have their own.

It is recommended to bring your own form of hydration, but bottles of water will be available at each ring. Keep in mind that these bottles are in a cooler and could be handled by others.

There will be no day-hauling until further notice.

ABSOLUTELY NO SPECTATORS! Brownland Farm is open to Essential People ONLY. This consists of Trainers, Riders, Owners, Parent/Guardian of minor participant, Grooms, Braiders, Competition Staff, and Support Staff (farriers, veterinarians, vendors, official show photographer). If you are not considered essential based on the above list, you are NOT ALLOWED to enter Brownland Farm.

Trainers will be held responsible for the conduct and adherence to the policies and rules set forth during the competition. **Any barn or trainer found in violation of current protocols & guidelines may be expelled from the facility.** PLEASE discuss with everyone who will be

attending the shows the importance of following the direction of horse show staff and security personnel.

Trainers are expected to keep their clients' barn-time limited. The less people in the barn areas, the better we protect ourselves and fellow show attendees. Trainers are to encourage their riders and owners to arrive as close to ride time as possible and to leave the show grounds promptly after they're finished riding.

The majority of stabling is shed-row type with the remainder aisle-way stabling. Extra attention will be placed on spacing in the barn aisles.

Steward(s) will be monitoring the following of protocols.

It is expected that each barn group does their part in keeping the stabling area clean & sanitized.

Each in-gate has limited spacing, and it will be expected that attention is given to allowing for social distancing in these areas and following direction of show management.

Ring order of go will be established and clearly communicated with attendees. Check-in procedures for classes will be announced closer to the event start.

SAFETY/MITIGATING THE SPREAD

Wash hands often with soap and water for at least 30 seconds. If soap and water is unavailable, use hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Hand sanitizers will be placed around the show facility, including around the rings and in the stabling area. There will also be 4 hand-washing stations around the show grounds.

Brownland Officials and Staff, service staff, and ALL participants will wear a face mask or face covering at all times. Exception is when mounted on a horse or eating, as long as social distancing practices are being respected.

Every member of essential staff and service will have their temperature checked by the Covid-19 Safety Coordinator prior to entering show grounds. Individuals with a temperature of 99.5 or above will not be allowed on premise. The location of the check will be at the round-about at The Anderton House between 6-7am every day.

All competitors and attendees are responsible for monitoring their own personal and family health prior to, during, and after attending a competition. **It is the trainer's responsibility to ensure that everyone in their barn is complying with this.**

Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.

No more than 1 person per seat golf carts or other similar vehicles. Again, masks MUST be worn.

Disinfectants will be placed at/near each warm-up jump in order to spray handled portions like jump cups or pins. Spray the jump cups and pins with the disinfectant when finished with a warm-up jump.

Signage will be posted throughout the showgrounds reminding of social distancing, handwashing and other safety guidelines, symptoms to watch for, etc. Public Address Announcements will be made throughout the day, each day, regarding current guidelines.

Social distancing guidelines must be followed at all times. This means there must be a minimum of 6' distance between individuals at all times, even among individuals within a barn group.

There will be no social gatherings, parties, or congregating anywhere on the facility.

In the event of inclement weather, shelter in your car or trailer. DO NOT GATHER IN THE BARNES.

GENERAL

No more than 10 people total in the show office. Upon entering, please follow social distancing parameters as set forth in the office. Plexiglass has been installed to assist in safety.

Braiding will be optional. Horses/Riders will not be penalized if they are not braided. BRAIDERS WILL ADHERE TO ALL GUIDELINES SET FORTH BY THE USEF, CDC, AND WHO.

Dogs can potentially come in contact with multiple people if loose on competition grounds. **DOGS MUST BE CONFINED/LEASHED AT ALL TIMES.** If a dog is found loose on Brownland Farm property, owners will be asked to leave with their pet(s).

All ribbons and awards will be available at a designated Award Station that will be clearly marked. Location TBD

Food services: Specific guidelines for ordering, picking up and paying will be established. Tabs are strongly encouraged to decrease potential for contact contamination.

Please discard of trash properly and use provided trash receptacles to avoid unnecessary handling of potentially contaminated items by staff. DO NOT LITTER!

ILLNESS PROTOCOL

ANYONE WHO EXHIBITS SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 OR HAS BEEN IN CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO HAS TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 WITHIN THE LAST 14 DAYS CANNOT ENTER BROWNLAND FARM PROPERTY!

Trainers/Owners should have a support plan in place for any person that is denied admittance to Brownland Farm.

For patients with respiratory illnesses who need assessment for COVID-19, the following are designated testing sites:
