Originally from Georgia, Justin started as an artist touring with Mallery Hope (Lauren Alaina). He eventually made the trek to Nashville and was signed by Sony as an artist.

Justin's career didn't exactly take the expected path. His songwriting took off and he has had chart-topping singles with Michael Ray "Kiss You In The Morning", "Later On" by the Swon Brothers, Randy Houser's, "We Went", "Drunk Me" by Mitchell Tenpenny, Craig Campbell's "Tomorrow Tonight," "John King's "On Your Lips," and Dean Alexander's "Life Ain't Fair."

"If there's someone I would love to have sing my song," says Justin "It would be Tim McGraw. "A Place in the Sun," is one of my all time favorite albums. I used to sit and listen, top to bottom over and over. I think I bought seven copies because over the years I'd lose one, or one would get scratched, and I always went back and bought another."



Matt Warren

Matt Warren was born in Nashville and went to MTSU. His first deal was with Muscle Shoals music icon founder and Rock-n-Roll Hall of Fame producer, Rick Hall.

Matt's first cut as a House of Fame writer was "Puttin' Memories Away", co-written with Gary Allan featured on the Oprah Winfrey show. Matt followed that success with 14 more songs co-written and recorded by Gary Allan.

Twice Matt has won ASCAP's Most Spins In A Year Award. In 2009, it was for Gary Allen's top 10 "Learning How to Bend". And in 2014, Matt won the ASCAP award and, nominated for the ACM Song of The Year and had the #1 Billboard, best selling Gary Allan single ever, "Every Storm Runs Out Of Rain".

Matt's 2018 lead single was with Robert Randolph & The Family Band's "Let Love Do What It Do" featuring Darius Rucker for which he received a Grammy nomination for the "Blues Record Of The Year". Matt co-wrote the song with Robert Randolph, Chris Gelbuda & Patrick Davis.
