Georgia Teacher Conservation Workshop "Exploring Forestry and Wildlife in Georgia" June 15 – 19, 2020 Charlie Elliott Wildlife Center Mansfield, GA



What is TCW?

The Teacher Conservation Workshop (TCW) is a weeklong professional development event that uses the forest as a window to environmental education. Activities are led by foresters, biologists, educators, and industry professionals. This interdisciplinary workshop focuses on the environmental, economic, and social benefits of Georgia's forestry and wildlife communities. Sessions take place offsite and mostly outdoors in the forest and manufacturing facilities within a 2-hour radius of Charlie Elliott. Sessions demonstrate the cycle of growing trees and managing for wildlife, water and recreation.

Who should attend TCW?

The TCW is geared for Georgia educators of grades 3-12. However, all educators, formal, non-formal, and senior/graduate pre-service educators in Georgia are encouraged to apply. This weeklong workshop is an introductory course for, but not limited to, non-forestry and non-wildlife educators. It requires a commitment to spend the entire week in an environmental education setting.

Note: This workshop includes moderate amounts of walking and standing.

What are the benefits?

The TCW emphasizes the importance of conservation of natural resources. with special attention given to Georgia's wildlife, forests, forest products and water. Participants will learn hands-on practical exercises that can supplement their classroom curricula and student projects. Certification in Projects Learning Tree, WET, and WILD is awarded at the completion of the workshop. Participants have the opportunity to receive a \$100 check upon completion and submission of a follow-up activity.

Where will I stay?

Overnight accommodations during the workshop will be at Charlie Elliott Wildlife Center (CEWC), centrally located in the state near Mansfield, GA on 6,400 acres managed by the GA Department of Natural Resources. Most sessions take place offsite at locations within a 2-hour radius of Charlie Elliott; transportation is provided. During the workshop, participants will share one of the 28 lodge-style guest rooms at the CEWC education center and enjoy buffet-style meals prepared on site at the conference center dining hall. How much does TCW cost?
