So, rather than expecting the provider to do sufficient research to present an unbiased position, we could create and require a form to be signed by the parent or guardian prior to administration of a mandatory vaccine. The form could present information much like the summary of a ballot measure, written by an independent entity, and even include statements by experts for and against with rebuttals. It could even be provided prior to the visit so that there is a waiting period (similar to buying a handgun). Because once you pull the trigger on a shot, there's no undo button.
