- **What is the Homecoming Project?**
An eight bed recovery house for women recovering from alcohol and substance abuse
- **When was it founded and by whom?**
2006 by Robin Keener and Jerry Carpenter
- **What specifically does Homecoming do?**
Comprehensive family oriented program of recovery from homelessness and substance abuse in a supportive environment using behavioral change and life skills management verse medicated maintenance.
- **How can a woman enter the Homecoming Project?**
Application and interview process is required
- **How long does it take to complete the program?**
An average of one year, depending on the clients progress
- **How does The Homecoming Project assist the County?**
It cost approximately \$110 a day in jail and ONLY \$20 a day for someone to stay at The Homecoming Project house.
- **How many women has the Homecoming Project treated since its founding nine years ago?**
We are proud to have serviced over 200 women
- **What is the average age of the clients?**
They range from 18-76 years of age.
- **What is the success rate?**
Our success rate is 80% which is much higher than the national average of 5%, which includes medicated maintenance.
- **The cost to run the house is \$350,000 per year therefore donations and fundraising is very important.**
